

Teacher Credential Decrease Slows

SACRAMENTO – While the number of newly credentialed teachers decreased again for the seventh straight year, the decrease was not as steep as recent years, according to the Commission on Teacher Credentialing’s [Teacher Supply in California, 2010-11](#). The Commission will review this report at their March 8 meeting in Sacramento.


For fiscal year 2010-11, California saw a 6.5 percent decrease from the prior year in the number of California prepared newly credentialed teachers. The 2009-10 decrease as reported in last year’s Teacher Supply report was 8 percent between 2008-2009. This decrease is unevenly distributed across the three types of preliminary credentials (Multiple Subject, Single Subject and Education Specialist) as the number of new special education teachers rose slightly by 5.5 percent.

Similarly, total teacher preparation enrollments reported under federal Title II regulations show that annual enrollments declined almost 23,400 over the past five years. This is a decrease of 39 percent between 2005-06 and 2009-10. Total teacher preparation enrollment was down 18.2 percent between 2008-09 and 2009-10.

As in prior years, the number of emergency-type permits decreased and the number of fully credentialed teachers increased to 98.7 of all California public school teachers in 2010-11. Overall, there was a decrease in the number of emergency-type [Short-Term Staff Permits (STSP) and Provisional Internship Permits (PIP)] by 37.1 percent during this reporting period.
