Program Approval

Introduction

This agenda item presents two single subject matter programs submitted by institutions of higher education for single subject matter program approval.

Background

The Commission regularly receives recommendations for program approval from single subject matter review panels. These panels of subject matter experts review all program documentation and make an informed determination whether the program meets the standards common to all subject matter programs and also the content specific subject matter standards. The content specific subject matter standards are closely aligned to the K-12 academic content standards. These subject matter programs are usually undergraduate courses of study completed before candidates begin teacher preparation programs. However, the two programs may be completed concurrently.

Subject Matter Program Review Procedures

Following are the general procedures for the review of subject matter programs:

1. Technical Assistance – After the Commission adopts a set of new program standards, Commission staff members provide technical assistance to prospective program sponsors wishing to submit responses to the new standards. Technical assistance materials are provided on the Commission’s website. Staff members train, assign, and coordinate review team work.
2. Preconditions Review – After the program proposal is received, Commission staff review the sponsor’s response to the preconditions. The preconditions are based on both state laws and Commission policies, and address minimum unit and content area requirements. If the preconditions response is incomplete, the sponsor is requested to provide specific information necessary for compliance with the preconditions.
3. Program Review – The program sponsor’s responses to the Commission’s subject matter program standards are reviewed by a team of two or more subject matter educators to determine if the program meets the program standards, including the subject matter requirements (SMRs). The SMRs are the content knowledge required to be covered in the program and are aligned to the K-12 content standards that the candidate will be expected to know. The reviewers are trained in the alignment of the standards and subject matter requirements and in the review process before they are assigned proposals to review. Reviewers are instructed to find explicit evidence that programs not only align with K-12 content standards but also introduce their candidates to those standards within the context of their subject matter studies. The team must reach consensus that each

standard is met based upon evidence provided in the document. If the program does not meet the standards, the sponsor is given an explanation of the findings. The sponsor may then submit the additional information requested. Once reviewers determine that the program proposal provides a convincing and adequate body of evidence to meet the Commission's adopted subject matter program standards, the program is recommended to the Commission for approval.

4. After subject matter program approval is granted by the Commission, the institution may admit candidates to the approved subject matter program. Graduates of a Commission approved single subject matter preparation program meet the Commission's subject matter requirement and are not required to take the subject matter examination (California Subject Examinations for Teachers -CSET).

This report presents two single subject matter programs which have been deemed to have met all of the appropriate *Standards of Quality and Effectiveness for Single Subject Matter Preparation Programs* (www.etc.ca.gov/educator-prep/STDS-subject-matter.html) by the appropriate review panel and are recommended to the Commission for approval. The programs have been aligned to the SB 2042 subject matter standards adopted by the Commission. The programs brought forward to the Commission at this time are California State University, Fresno: Music and California Baptist University: Mathematics.

Summary Information on the Single Subject Matter Programs

California State University, Fresno: Music

The Department of Music at California State University, Fresno considers the preparation of future music educators to be among its highest priorities. The music subject matter program is founded on the philosophy that all children deserve a quality comprehensive and sequential music education program that emphasizes performing, reading, writing, creating, and listening. Candidates who complete the program will have a broad preparation which will enable them to successfully deliver the various components in comprehensive and sequential music education programs typically found in schools in California. The design of the music subject matter program balances the need to develop individual musicianship with the obligation to provide candidates with a foundation of skills and knowledge that will make them effective music educators. The program develops mastery of performance on a primary instrument or voice; proficiency in candidates' selected area of emphasis: choral, general, or instrumental; and competency in other music education skills and knowledge necessary to successfully teach in California's public school music programs. The program has been carefully designed so that it is as closely aligned as possible with the California *Visual and Performing Arts Content Standards for California Public Schools*, recognizing that, for candidates to teach in accordance with the state standards, they must have been taught the material, techniques, and approaches indicated by those standards. Attention is given to the multi-lingual character of California's schools and the challenges of teaching in this environment.

The music program at CSU, Fresno provides candidates with experiences as performers, as well as a solid background in the history and theory of music. Although the program is built on a strong foundation of understanding the rich Euro-American musical traditions, candidates study those traditions in relation to the music of other peoples and cultures as listeners and performers. The predominant United States musical traditions are explored and compared through listening and analysis with special attention to the cultural contexts in which those musical traditions were born and flourish. Candidates learn how to use current technology for music making, composition, and arranging and also for teaching musical skills and knowledge. Music education program completers will be able to demonstrate the following outcomes:

- knowledge and understanding of the elements of music in their appropriate context
- musically sensitive and technically proficient performance both as an individual and in an ensemble
- knowledge of musical literature from a variety of styles and genres
- ability in creative skills (composing, arranging, improvising)
- conducting skill and knowledge of effective rehearsal techniques
- ability in secondary performance areas including voice, keyboard, and orchestral/band instruments
- knowledge of general music techniques including use of classroom instruments
- the ability to select high quality, developmentally appropriate literature and materials for use in various K -12 music classroom settings
- skill in the use of technology to enhance music learning
- knowledge of proper sequencing and of developmentally appropriate lessons in both elementary and secondary general music, and secondary ensemble classrooms
- understanding of appropriate assessment strategies to measure student achievement in a variety of contexts
- sensitivity to the diverse student population of California
- understanding of appropriate classroom management techniques to promote an effective learning environment.
- knowledge and understanding of the *California Content Standards for Music*.

California Baptist University: Mathematics

California Baptist University Single Subject Matter Program in Mathematics is designed to address the *Mathematics Content Standards for California Public Schools (1997)*. The purpose and philosophy of the Single Subject Matter Preparation Programs (SSMPP) are based on the premise that subject matter learning is essential to becoming a professional educator. Candidate learning begins with general education coursework and continues through advanced mathematics coursework required for completion of the subject matter program and early classroom field experiences. The course objectives reflect the mathematics outcomes, including the ability to demonstrate an understanding of the:

- foundations and concepts of algebra from an advanced, conceptual standpoint, using symbolic reasoning and algebraic skills and concepts to model a variety of problem-solving situations
- foundations, concepts, and structures of geometry with its axiomatic systems and different forms of logical arguments to apply and prove theorems for two- and

- three-dimensional geometry, including coordinate, synthetic, non-Euclidean, and transformational geometry
- concepts of number theory and a command of number sense from an advanced standpoint by proving and using properties of natural numbers to formulate conjectures based on inductive reasoning that is verified with proofs
 - concepts and structures of statistics and probability distributions from an advanced standpoint to solve problems and make inferences
 - concepts and structures of trigonometry and calculus to solve problems in real-world situations
 - chronological and topical development of mathematics, the contributions of historical figures of various times and cultures, and the important mathematical discoveries and their impact on human society and thought

Recommendations

Based upon a determination by reviewers that the following entities have met all relevant standards and requirements, staff recommends Commission approval of the following subject matter programs:

California State University, Fresno: Music

California Baptist University: Mathematics
