Program Approval

Introduction

This agenda item presents one single subject matter program submitted by an institution of higher education for approval.

Background

The Commission regularly receives recommendations for program approval from single subject matter review panels. These panels of subject matter experts review all program documentation and make an informed determination whether the program meets the standards common to all subject matter programs and also the content specific subject matter standards. The content specific subject matter standards are closely aligned to the K-12 academic content standards. These subject matter programs are usually undergraduate courses of study completed before candidates begin teacher preparation programs. However, the two programs may be completed concurrently.

Subject Matter Program Review Procedures

Following are the general procedures for the review of subject matter programs:

1. Technical Assistance – After the Commission adopts a set of new program standards, Commission staff members provide technical assistance to prospective program sponsors wishing to submit responses to the new standards. Technical assistance materials are provided on the Commission’s website. Staff members train, assign, and coordinate review team work.
2. Preconditions Review – After the program proposal is received, Commission staff review the sponsor’s response to the preconditions. The preconditions are based on both state laws and Commission policies, and address minimum unit and content area requirements. If the preconditions response is incomplete, the sponsor is requested to provide specific information necessary for compliance with the preconditions.
3. Program Review – The program sponsor’s responses to the Commission’s subject matter program standards are reviewed by a team of two or more subject matter educators to determine if the program meets the program standards, including the subject matter requirements (SMRs). The SMRs are the content knowledge required to be covered in the program and are aligned to the K-12 content standards that the candidate will be expected to know. The reviewers are trained in the alignment of the standards and subject matter requirements and in the review process before they are assigned proposals to review. Reviewers are instructed to find explicit evidence that programs not only align with K-12 content standards but also introduce their candidates to those standards within the context of their subject matter studies. The team must reach consensus that each

standard is met based upon evidence provided in the document. If the program does not meet the standards, the sponsor is given an explanation of the findings. The sponsor may then submit the additional information requested. Once reviewers determine that the program proposal provides a convincing and adequate body of evidence to meet the Commission's adopted subject matter program standards, the program is recommended to the Commission for approval.

4. After subject matter program approval is granted by the Commission, the institution may admit candidates to the approved subject matter program. Graduates of a Commission approved single subject matter preparation program meet the Commission's subject matter requirement and are not required to take the subject matter examination (California Subject Examinations for Teachers).

This report presents one single subject matter program that has been deemed to have met all of the appropriate *Standards of Quality and Effectiveness for Single Subject Matter Preparation Programs* (www.ctc.ca.gov/educator-prep/STDS-subject-matter.html) by appropriate review panels and is recommended to the Commission for approval. The program brought forward to the Commission for approval at this time is: California Baptist University, Music.

Summary Information on the Proposed Single Subject Matter Program

California Baptist University

The Single Subject Matter Program for preparation in Music at California Baptist University prepares students to teach music within primary and secondary educational settings. The candidates will receive an education focusing on musical performance and musician skill development, in addition to developing theoretical understandings. Embedded in the 65 units of core breadth courses are related subjects designed to connect skills, knowledge and abilities commonly taught in California public schools.

Candidates demonstrate proficiency in brass, woodwind, string, and percussion instruments, as well as in music technology and world music. Candidates also have opportunities to direct student ensembles and conduct large groups where they work alongside music teachers currently employed in K-12 settings.

The School of Music faculty at California Baptist University brings a variety of experience with careers in both private and public schools and at other universities. The lead Music Education professor has taught all areas of music, including choral, instrumental, and general music ranging from elementary, middle, and high school to the university level.

A goal of the program is to model ways in which prospective teachers can effectively utilize tools that are outside of their personal learning preferences to meet the needs of the diverse student population they will encounter in the California classroom.

Recommendations

Based upon a determination by reviewers that the following entity has met all relevant standards and requirements, staff recommends Commission approval of the following subject matter program: California Baptist University : Music.

Proposed Amendments to Conflict of Interest Code of the Commission on Teacher Credentialing

Introduction

This agenda item reflects proposed amendments to the Title 5, California Code of Regulations, section 80225, which constitutes the conflict of interest code for the Commission on Teacher Credentialing (Commission). Governmental agencies are required to update their conflict of interest code when organizational changes occur therefore these amendments are relative to changes to the current organizational structure of the Commission. Upon approval of this item by the Commission, a Notice of Intention to Amend will be published, initiating a 45-day public comment period on changes to the conflict of interest code. At the conclusion of the comment period, it will be recommended that the Commission adopt the proposed amendments to the conflict of interest code.

Proposed Amendments to the Regulation

The proposed text is as follows, with new language indicated by underline, and deletions by ~~strikethrough~~:

80225. General Provisions

The Political Reform Act, Government Code Sections 81000, et seq., requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate conflict of interest codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation, 2 Cal. Code of Regulations Section 18730, which contains the terms of a standard conflict of interest code, which can be incorporated by reference in an agency's code, ~~and which may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act~~ After public notice and hearings, the standard code may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act. Therefore, the terms of 2 California Code of Regulations Section 18730 and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission are hereby incorporated by reference. Therefore, the terms of 2 Cal. Code of Regulations Section 18730 and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission, This regulation and the attached Appendix, designating positions and establishing disclosure categories, shall constitute the conflict of interest code along with the attached Appendix in which officials and positions are designated and disclosure categories are set forth, are hereby incorporated by reference and constitute the conflict of interest code of the Commission on Teacher Credentialing (Agency).

Individuals holding designated positions shall file statements of economic interests with the Agency. Upon receipt of the statements of the Commissioners and Executive Director, the Agency shall make and retain a copy and forward the originals of these statements to the Fair Political Practices Commission. Statements for all other designated positions will be retained by the Agency, which shall make them available for public inspection and reproduction. (Government Code Section 81008.)

~~For the remainder of the designated positions, the Agency shall, upon receipt of their statements, file them and make available for public inspection and reproduction upon request (Government Code Section 81008).~~

Staff Recommendation
