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# Program Approval

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## **Introduction**

This agenda item presents four single subject matter programs submitted by institutions of higher education for single subject matter program approval.

## **Background**

The Commission regularly receives recommendations for program approval from single subject matter review panels. These panels of subject matter experts review all program documentation and make an informed determination whether the program meets the standards common to all subject matter programs and also the content specific subject matter standards. The content specific subject matter standards are closely aligned to the K-12 academic content standards. These subject matter programs are usually undergraduate courses of study completed before candidates begin teacher preparation programs. However, the two programs may be completed concurrently.

## **Subject Matter Program Review Procedures**

Following are the general procedures for the review of subject matter programs:

1. Technical Assistance – After the Commission adopts a set of new program standards, Commission staff members provide technical assistance to prospective program sponsors wishing to submit responses to the new standards. Technical assistance materials are provided on the Commission’s website. Staff members train, assign, and coordinate review team work.
2. Preconditions Review – After the program proposal is received, Commission staff review the sponsor’s response to the preconditions. The preconditions are based on both state laws and Commission policies, and address minimum unit and content area requirements. If the preconditions response is incomplete, the sponsor is requested to provide specific information necessary for compliance with the preconditions.
3. Program Review – The program sponsor’s responses to the Commission’s subject matter program standards are reviewed by a team of two or more subject matter educators to determine if the program meets the program standards, including the subject matter requirements (SMRs). The SMRs are the content knowledge required to be covered in the program and are aligned to the K-12 content standards that the candidate will be expected to know. The reviewers are trained in the alignment of the standards and subject matter requirements and in the review process before they are assigned proposals to review. Reviewers are instructed to find explicit evidence that programs not only align with K-12 content standards but also introduce their candidates to those standards within the context of their subject matter studies. The team must reach consensus that each standard is met based upon evidence provided in the document. If the program does not meet the standards, the sponsor is given an explanation of the findings. The sponsor may then submit the additional information

requested. Once reviewers determine that the program proposal provides a convincing and adequate body of evidence to meet the Commission's adopted subject matter program standards, the program is recommended to the Commission for approval.

4. After subject matter program approval is granted by the Commission, the institution may admit candidates to the approved subject matter program. Graduates of a Commission approved single subject matter preparation program meet the Commission's subject matter requirement and are not required to take the subject matter examination (California Subject Examinations for Teachers -CSET).

This report presents four single subject matter programs which have been deemed to have met all of the appropriate *Standards of Quality and Effectiveness for Single Subject Matter Preparation Programs* ([www.ctc.ca.gov/educator-prep/STDS-subject-matter.html](http://www.ctc.ca.gov/educator-prep/STDS-subject-matter.html)) by the appropriate review panel and are recommended to the Commission for approval. The programs have been aligned to the SB 2042 subject matter standards adopted by the Commission. The programs brought forward to the Commission at this time are California State University, Chico: Art; California State University, Chico: Physical Education; California State University, Long Beach: Home Economics; and Otis College of Art and Design: Art.

### **Summary Information on the Single Subject Matter Programs**

#### California State University, Chico: Art

The philosophy and the goals of the California State University, Chico Art Education Program include providing knowledge of developmental and expressive aspects of children's art as well as developing literacy and competency in Visual Art consistent with the *Visual and Performing Arts Content Standards for California Public Schools: Prekindergarten through Grade Twelve*. Prospective teachers in the program also develop intellectual curiosity, sharpen their critical thinking skills, learn to express themselves coherently, and gain an appreciation of the wide range of circumstances and abilities found among students throughout California. The program's coursework insures foundational experiences in art production, art criticism, art history, and aesthetic theory as well as history of art education theory and practice, appropriate research strategies, and art-related cognitive functioning theories. Program faculty are a dedicated group of artists and scholars deeply involved with art, both student work and their own work. As teachers, they pride themselves on maintaining high standards that employ both well-tested and innovative methods. In class and individual critiques, they integrate aesthetic, political, historical, and moral issues with art studies. Senior candidates' creative and teaching abilities are evaluated through an exit portfolio, which addresses four major learning outcomes in art education program:

- Breadth of knowledge about art and its materials, form, content and meaning within cultural, historical and social contexts in both western and non-western traditions;
- Written expression of creative and pedagogical intent;
- Application of theories and methodologies of teaching and learning in the arts; and
- Technical and communication skills in several art-based media and reasonable mastery of at least one medium.

#### California State University, Chico: Physical Education

The subject matter program in physical education at California State University, Chico emphasizes the skills, content, and activities that are most commonly taught in the public

schools and that address the *Physical Education Model Content Standards for California Public Schools*. The core courses provide opportunities for candidates to learn concepts which they later apply during field experiences at local schools working with K-12 students. The program is designed to provide both depth and breadth of learning for prospective teachers of K-12 physical education in California schools. The subject matter program prepares teachers to be agents of change who can cope with the realities of today's schools and possess the skills and leadership to justify and elevate physical education as a dynamic school subject. Candidates are expected to achieve the following outcomes during the program:

- knowledge and disciplinary concepts related to the field of Kinesiology, including the concepts, forms, psychology, sociology and science of human movement and motor learning; and integration of movement with other disciplines
- knowledge of effective verbal, nonverbal, and media communication techniques to enhance learning and engagement in physical activity
- reflective and critical thinking to refine professional practice
- evidence-based knowledge and skills (and best practices) for assessing client/student needs and for designing, implementing and evaluating physical education programs
- professional behaviors, including commitment to excellence, valuing diversity and collaboration, service to others, and techniques for lifelong learning
- a philosophy that physical activity programs are important to health and well being of individuals, and that physical activity can foster self-expression, development, and learning

#### California State University, Long Beach: Home Economics

The Home Economics Subject Matter Program at California State University, Long Beach reflects and is developed in alignment with the *California Career Technical Education Model Curriculum Standards Grades Seven Through Twelve* (in Home Economics). The Subject Matter Program is designed to provide students with a foundation in the full range of family and consumer sciences, while also providing the training and experiences necessary for a successful teaching career in the ethnically and culturally diverse California public schools. The program of study includes lecture classes, laboratory learning, fieldwork experiences, and an internship experience. Upon completion of the program, candidates will effectively and competently be able to:

- demonstrate knowledge of child development, family relationships, nutrition and wellness, clothing and textiles, consumer and resource management, and living environments;
- articulate the work of the family, which involves resolution of the everyday situations, including maintaining adequate nutrition, meeting clothing and textile needs, providing a positive physical and emotional environment for family members, and balancing the requirements of employment and family life;
- apply knowledge of the family systems of action and integrate the use of critical and creative thinking skills to address everyday recurring situations faced by families and affecting their quality of life;
- demonstrate knowledge of career paths in each area of family and consumer sciences;
- design a professional development plan for continuous learning and growth.

### Otis College of Art and Design: Art

The Otis Art Education Program provides Fine Arts candidates with: 1) a well-rounded and in-depth education in the studio art major of their choice; 2) a broad, academically rigorous foundation in arts and education practice and theory; and 3) an overview of skills and knowledge needed to teach diverse students in California schools. The program is designed in alignment with the *Visual and Performing Arts Content Standards for California Public Schools: Prekindergarten through Grade Twelve* and underscores research in the fields of art, education and psychology which demonstrates the importance of the arts to learning. Candidates receive a broader perspective on teaching at the kindergarten through twelfth grade levels (K–12) and the ways teaching interfaces with one’s career as an artist in diverse settings and communities. Candidates who complete the program will:

- acquire fundamental skills, which include mindful making and improving of work by the manipulation of art and design media
- discern visual quality through identifying visual strengths and weaknesses to promote aesthetic resolution and clarity of intention
- develop an integrated understanding of technical and conceptual aspects transferable across a wide array of art and design practices
- learn discipline-specific skills in photography, painting, sculpture/new genres, drawings, video and digital/new media
- be able to think critically, critique art, and contextualize their work with appropriate concepts from history, cultural theory, contemporary art, public and global life, and ethics
- be conversant with interdisciplinary concepts and approaches in contemporary art
- develop a meaningful connection between their studio art/design practice and an engagement with diverse communities
- demonstrate an understanding of the practices and theories of arts education and community engagement
- investigate visual culture, its historical origins, and its influence on cultural, intellectual, and artistic structures from multicultural perspectives
- understand career opportunities for community-based and teaching artists/designers

### **Recommendations**
