Proposed Additions and Amendments to 5 California Code of Regulations Pertaining to Adult Education Teaching Credentials

Executive Summary: This agenda item proposes additions and amendments to Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations pertaining to the issuance of Designated Subjects Adult Education Teaching Credentials due to the passage of recent legislation.

Proposed Additions and Amendments to 5 California Code of Regulations Pertaining to Adult Education Teaching Credentials

Introduction

Governor Schwarzenegger signed Assembly Bill (AB) 1374 (Chap. 36, Stats. 2010) on July 6, 2010. The provisions of AB 1374 that become effective on January 1, 2011 amend the Education Code (EC) sections pertaining to the issuance of Adult Education Teaching Credentials.

The proposed addition and amendments to Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations will implement the provisions of AB 1374.

Background

The Commission directed staff to recruit an expert advisory panel in April 2008 to review the requirements for adult education teaching credentials as well as the *Standards of Quality and Effectiveness for Designated Subjects Adult Education Programs*. The panel's recommendations pertaining to the adult education teaching credential requirements were presented to the Commission in March 2009. Several of the panel's recommendations required changes to statute, which resulted in AB 1374 by Assembly Member Brownley.

AB 1374 amended EC §§44260.2 and 44260.3 related to the issuance of adult education teaching credentials and included several recommendations by the advisory panel as follows:

- 1) Reduces the years of experience required for general subjects (formerly termed 'non-academic' subjects) from 5 years to 3 years;
- 2) Reduces the term of the preliminary credential from five years to three years;
- 3) Moves the U.S. Constitution requirement from the preliminary to clear credential;
- 4) Deletes EC section 44260.8 related to the health education and computer education requirements and incorporates that language into EC section 44260.3 pertaining to the requirements for the clear credential; and
- 4) Consolidates the 'full-time' and 'part-time' designations.

The *Standards of Quality and Effectiveness for Adult Education Teachers* are currently under review by the Commission and program sponsors will write to the new standards once they are approved. The Commission will continue to issue five-year 'full-time' and 'part-time' preliminary adult education teaching credentials based on five years of full-time experience or education under the current regulations until an adult education program sponsor receives approval from the Committee on Accreditation or when a program document has substantially completed the review process needing only a few technical changes under the new standards. Once a program sponsor meets one of the aforementioned conditions and has confirmed that it is offering the Early Orientation (required by the draft standards), the Three-Year Preliminary

Adult Education Teaching Credential based on three years of experience or education may be requested. Issuance of Three-Year Preliminary Adult Education Teaching Credentials will be phased in as follows:

From January 1, 2011 until June 30, 2013, the Commission will be issuing six types of Designated Subjects Adult Education Teaching Credentials. Individuals issued Preliminary Full-Time or Part-Time Adult Education Teaching Credentials under pre-AB 1374 regulations will be allowed time to complete their current programs. The following chart lists the six types of Designated Subjects Adult Education Teaching Credentials, the proposed regulation addition or amendments, and the associated sunset dates:

The proposed regulations include the following recommendations made by the adult education advisory panel that were not included in AB 1374:

- 1) Require submission of preliminary and clear adult education teaching credential applications through Commission-approved program sponsors;
- 2) Change the 'non-academic' category to 'general subjects' and include the two new general subjects categories of Career Technical Education and Personal Development available on the Three-Year Preliminary and Clear Adult Education Teaching Credential issued pursuant to AB 1374
- 3) Allow advanced industry certificates to qualify for one year of the three years of experience required to qualify for the Three-Year Preliminary Adult Education Teaching Credential in a general subjects area, as determined by a Commission-approved program sponsor;

- 4) Accept one year of teaching experience earned while holding a general education teaching credential toward the three years of experience required to qualify for the Three-Year Preliminary Adult Education Teaching Credential in a general subjects area; and
- 5) Update the criteria to qualify for the academic subject area of English as a Second Language.

Proposed Amendments to Regulations

Section 80034

The title of this section has been amended to add ‘Adult Education Teaching’ as the definitions and terms now only apply to the issuance of Adult Education Teaching Credentials. The Commission no longer initially issues Vocational Education Teaching Credentials and the definitions and terms for Career Technical Education Teaching Credentials are provided in §80034.1.

(a): ‘Teaching’ has been added to the opening to accurately reflect the name of the Adult Education *Teaching* Credential.

(b): The term ‘non-academic’ has been amended to ‘general subjects’ per recommendation of the advisory panel and added ‘teaching’ to accurately reflect the name of the Adult Education *Teaching* Credential.

(b)(2): Per recommendation of the advisory panel, Career Technical Education added as a general subjects category available for three-year preliminary and clear adult education credentials issued under the provisions of AB 1374.

(b)(3): Renumbered from (b)(2) due to the addition of the new subject category described above.

(b)(4): Renumbered from (b)(3) due to the addition of the new subject category in (b)(2).

(b)(5): Renumbered from (b)(4) due to the addition of the new subject category in (b)(2).

(b)(6): Renumbered from (b)(5) due to the addition of the new subject category in (b)(2) and deleted the ‘and’ because more than one category follows.

(b)(7): Per recommendation of the advisory panel, Personal Development added as a general subjects category available for three-year preliminary and clear adult education credentials issued under the provisions of AB 1374.

(b)(8): Renumbered from (b)(6) due to the addition of the new subject categories in (b)(2) and (b)(7).

(c): The definition of “Commission-approved LEA” has been amended to “Commission-approved program of personalized preparation” for consistency with the language used in the amendments below. The term ‘LEA’ pertains to a ‘Local Education Agency’, which does not accurately reflect all the types of agencies that are allowed to develop and implement adult education credential programs.

In addition, deleting redundant language and the reference to §§80040.2 and 80040.2.5 that reference the Level I and Level II programs. Level I and Level II programs are required for full-

time/part-time adult education teaching credentials; however, new program standards that will not have the same structure are currently under Commission review and the Commission will not review or approve any new Level I or Level II programs. Commission staff is also proposing deletion of the reference to §80042 due to its repeal on May 11, 2009 and the addition of the adult education teaching credential title for clarity.

(c)(5): Amended the semicolon (;) to a period (.) at the end of this subsection due to the addition of subsection (c)(6).

(c)(6): Charter schools have been added as subsection (a)(6) as an agency authorized to develop an adult education program of personalized preparation.

(d): To avoid any potential mandated costs, this section has been amended to clarify that an ESD is a California employer that ‘elects to’ employ individuals with designated subjects teaching credentials to teach adults. ‘Vocational’ and ‘special subjects’ have been deleted from this section as the definitions and terms pertain only to adult education teaching credentials.

(e): Language deleted and added to clarify that the definition for successful teaching pertains only to adult education teaching credentials. In addition, deleted ‘five-year’ from the definition as the Commission will be issuing five-year (§§80036 and 80036.1) and three-year (§80036.4) preliminary adult education credentials until June 30, 2013. Also deleted the language requiring two terms with one ESD since adult education teachers may potentially have more than one employer.

(e)(1): Subsection number deleted and language will be included in (e) as explained above.

(e)(2): Subsection language pertaining to vocational education teaching credentials deleted.

(f): Section deleted; the program definition is provided in section (c). Section (g) renumbered to section (f).

(f)(1): Renumbered from (g)(1).

(f)(2): Renumbered from (g)(2) and deleted the outdated examples for foreign equivalents. Individuals who receive foreign diplomas and/or degrees must have their transcripts evaluated by a Commission-approved foreign transcript evaluation agency for equivalency.

(g): Section (n) will be renumbered to (g). See amendment explanations in section (n) below.

(h): Deleting the definition for ‘work experience’ related to the issuance of preliminary vocational education teaching credentials. The last initial issuance date for preliminary vocational education teaching credentials was August 31, 2010 [reference §§80035(a)(7) and 80035.1(a)(6)]. Section (o) will be renumbered to (h). See amendment explanations in section (o) below.

(i): Deleted the definition for ‘vocational teaching experience’ related to the issuance of preliminary vocational education teaching credentials. The last initial issuance date for preliminary vocational education teaching credentials was August 31, 2010 [reference §§ 80035(a)(7) and 80035.1(a)(6)].

(j): Deleted the definition for ‘college level related coursework’ related to the issuance of preliminary vocational education teaching credentials. The last initial issuance date for preliminary vocational education teaching credentials was August 31, 2010 [reference §§ 80035(a)(7) and 80035.1(a)(6)].

(k): Deleted the definition for ‘non-college related coursework’ related to the issuance of preliminary vocational education teaching credentials. The last initial issuance date for preliminary vocational education teaching credentials was August 31, 2010 [reference §§ 80035(a)(7) and 80035.1(a)(6)].

(l): Deleted the definition for ‘occupational internship’ related to the issuance of preliminary vocational education teaching credentials. The last initial issuance date for preliminary vocational education teaching credentials was August 31, 2010 [reference §§80035(a)(7) and 80035.1(a)(6)].

(m): Deleted the definition for ‘supervised occupational student teaching’ related to the issuance of preliminary vocational education teaching credentials. The last initial issuance date for preliminary vocational education teaching credentials was August 31, 2010 [reference §§ 80035(a)(7) and 80035.1(a)(6)].

(n): Renumbered to (g) due to the deletion of the sections above. Also deleted the reference to ‘work experience’, which was a term related to the issuance of preliminary vocational education teaching credentials. The last initial issuance date for preliminary vocational education teaching credentials was August 31, 2010 [reference §§80035(a)(7) and 80035.1(a)(6)].

(o): Renumbered to (h) due to the deletion of the sections above and deleted the redundant language indicating that the section pertains to adult education teaching credentials. The whole section now provides definitions and terms related to this type of credential, only. In addition, the number of clock hours required to equal one year of experience has been amended from 1500 to 1000 hours as recommended by the advisory panel in March 2009.

Note: Deleted the referenced Education Code sections related to Career Technical Education and Special Subjects Teaching Credentials.

Section 80036

(a): Added language to clarify that full-time adult education teaching credentials are not available in any general subjects that fall under the new Career Technical Education and Personal Development categories. The new categories are only available on three-year preliminary and clear adult education teaching credentials issued under the provisions of AB 1374 (reference §80036.4).

(a)(4): EC §44252 allows for additional options to passage of the California Basic Educational Skills Test (CBEST) to satisfy the basic skills requirement. The proposed change is to update the basic skills requirement language in this subsection to match and align with statute. ‘Non-academic’ amended to ‘general’ subjects to align with the recommendation of the advisory panel.

(a)(5): Deleted the language pertaining to LEAs (a term that is no longer used) and ESDs (who will no longer have the authority to submit adult education applications to the Commission for processing).

(a)(6): Deleted the application revision date and added reference to §80001, which now provides definitions for applications used for certification purposes. In addition, deleted the language that duplicates the credential requirements listed in (1) through (5); deleted the LEA recommendation language that will be listed separately in subsection (a)(7); added the specific subsection reference for the required fee; changed the period (.) at the end of the subsection to a semicolon (;) due to the addition of subsection (a)(7).

Language pertaining to the completion of livescan is also proposed. EC §44340 requires the submission of identification (fingerprint) cards with each application. However, the Department of Justice now requires submission of fingerprints via livescan (electronic process) and no longer accepts fingerprint cards (Senate Bill 970, Chap. 470, Stats. 2003, effective July 1, 2005). Staff is recommending the addition of livescan to this subsection along with the deletion of the language pertaining to fingerprint cards and the obsolete form that was previously required with the fingerprint cards (Application for Character and Identification Clearance).

(a)(7): Added to require recommendation for the preliminary credential by a Commission-approved program of personalized preparation.

(a)(8): Added to set the final issuance date for an initial Preliminary Five-Year Full-Time Adult Education Teaching Credential.

(b)(2): All references to Commission-approved LEAs and ESDs have been deleted to avoid any potential claims for reimbursement of mandated costs. It is the responsibility of the credential holder to obtain verification from the approved program that he/she has completed the Level I requirement and to provide the verification to his/her employer.

(c): Deleted entire section as it outlines the provisions for a one-time preliminary reissuance to individuals who do not satisfy the teaching experience requirement. Regulations pertaining to appeals are provided in §80523, so the information provided in this section is not needed. Section (d) renumbered to (c).

(c)(1): Renumbered from (d)(1) and added 'full-time' for clarity.

(c)(2): Renumbered from (d)(2) and proposing deletion of superfluous language pertaining to the teaching experience requirement. Other minor language additions made for clarification.

(c)(3): Renumbered from (d)(3). Language requiring verification of program completion by a Commission-approved LEA deleted to avoid any potential claims for reimbursement of mandated costs. Program completion will be verified by the Commission-approved program of personalized preparation upon recommendation of the applicant per subsections (c)(6).

(c)(4): Renumbered from (d)(4). Language pertaining to the health education requirement clarified and now includes the appropriate Education Code reference.

(c)(5): Renumbered from (d)(5). Deleted the application revision date and added reference to §80001, which now provides definitions for applications used for certification purposes. In

addition, deleted the language that duplicates the credential requirements listed in (1) through (4); deleted the LEA recommendation language that will be listed separately in subsection (c)(6); and added the specific subsection reference for the required fee.

(c)(6): Subsection added to require recommendation for the preliminary credential by a Commission-approved program of personalized preparation.

(c)(7): Subsection added to establish the program completion date for the Clear Full-Time Adult Education Teaching Credential.

(d): Renumbered from (e) due to the deletion of the language in (c).

(e): Renumbered from (f) due to the deletion of the language in (c).

(e)(1): Renumbered from (f)(1). Deleted 'ing' from the end of 'except' for clarity; deleted the application revision date and added reference to §80001, which now provides definitions for applications used for certification purposes; and added the specific subsection reference for the required fee.

(e)(2): Renumbered from (f)(2). All references to Commission-approved LEAs and ESDs deleted to avoid any potential claims for reimbursement of mandated costs. It is the responsibility of the credential holder to obtain verification from the approved program that he/she has completed the Level I requirement and to provide the verification to his/her employer.

(e)(3): Renumbered from (f)(3). Subsection allowing for a five year reissuance of a preliminary full-time adult education teaching credential deleted due to the deletion of the language in section (c) and because the final date to complete the requirements for a clear full-time adult education credential is June 30, 2016 as stated in subsection (c)(7) [as renumbered from (d)(7)].

Subsection (f)(4) renumbered to (e)(3) and the referenced section amended from (d) to (c) due to earlier amendments.

(g): Proposing deletion of this section, as renewal of clear credentials is provided in §80493 and EC §44251(a)(4). Also proposing deletion of the language pertaining to professional growth requirements pursuant to amendments to EC §44227(a) that removed professional growth requirements for renewal of teaching and services credentials.

Note: Added EC § 44225(e): authority to determine the scope and authorization of credentials; EC §44259(c)(4)(A); health education requirement; and EC §§ 44339, 44340, and 44341: fingerprint clearance and professional fitness. Deleted EC §44253 pertaining to instruction of English learners which is not related to adult education credentials; EC §§44260.2 and 44260.3 that now pertain to the new 3-year preliminary and clear adult education credentials; and EC §§ 44260.8 and 44277 which are redundant references for the health education and CPR requirements.

Section 80036.1

(a): Added language to clarify that part-time adult education teaching credentials are not available in any general subjects that fall under the new Career Technical Education and Personal Development categories. The new categories are only available on three-year

preliminary and clear adult education teaching credentials issued under the provisions of AB 1374 (reference §80036.4).

(a)(3): EC §44252 allows for additional options to passage of the California Basic Educational Skills Test (CBEST) to satisfy the basic skills requirement. The proposed change is to update the basic skills requirement language in this subsection to match and align with statute. ‘Non-academic’ amended to ‘general’ subjects to align with the recommendation of the advisory panel.

It is the responsibility of the credential holder to obtain verification from the approved program that he/she has completed the Level I requirement and to provide the verification to his/her employer.

(c): Deleted entire section as it outlines the provisions for a one-time preliminary reissuance to individuals who do not satisfy the teaching experience requirement. Regulations pertaining to appeals are provided in §80523, so the information provided in this section is not needed. Section (d) renumbered to (c).

(c)(1): Renumbered from (d)(1) and added ‘part-time’ for clarity.

(c)(2): Renumbered from (d)(2) and proposing deletion of superfluous language pertaining to the teaching experience requirement. Other minor language additions made for clarification.

(c)(3): Renumbered from (d)(3). Language requiring verification of program completion by a Commission-approved LEA deleted to avoid any potential claims for reimbursement of mandated costs. Program completion will be verified by the Commission-approved program of personalized preparation upon recommendation of the applicant per subsections (c)(6).

(c)(4): Renumbered from (d)(4). Language pertaining to the health education requirement clarified and now includes the appropriate Education Code reference.

(c)(5): Renumbered from (d)(5). Deleted the application revision date and added reference to §80001, which now provides definitions for applications used for certification purposes. In addition, deleted the language that duplicates the credential requirements listed in (1) through (4); deleted the LEA recommendation language that will be listed separately in subsection (c)(6); and added the specific subsection reference for the required fee.

(c)(6): Subsection added to require recommendation for the preliminary credential by a Commission-approved program of personalized preparation.

(c)(7): Subsection added to establish the program completion date for the Clear Part-Time Adult Education Teaching Credential.

(d): Renumbered from (e) due to the deletion of the language in (c).

(e): Renumbered from (f) due to the deletion of the language in (c).

(e)(1): Renumbered from (f)(1). All references to Commission-approved LEAs and ESDs deleted to avoid any potential claims for reimbursement of mandated costs. It is the responsibility of the credential holder to obtain verification from the approved program that he/she has completed the Level I requirement and to provide the verification to his/her employer.

(e)(2): Renumbered from (f)(2). Deleted language allowing for a five year reissuance of a preliminary part-time adult education teaching credential due to the deletion of the language in section (c) and because the final date to complete the requirements for a clear part-time adult education credential is June 30, 2016 as stated in subsection (c)(7) [as renumbered from (d)(7)]. Subsection (3) renumbered to (4) and the referenced section amended from (d) to (c) due to earlier amendments.

(g): Proposing deletion of this section, as renewal of clear credentials is provided in §80493 and EC §44251(a)(4). Also proposing deletion of the language pertaining to professional growth requirements pursuant to amendments to EC §44227(a) that removed professional growth requirements for renewal of teaching and services credentials.

Note: Added EC §44225(e): authority to determine the scope and authorization of credentials; EC §44252: basic skills requirement; EC §44259(c)(4)(A)-health education requirement; and EC §§44339, 44340, and 44341: fingerprint clearance and professional fitness. Deleted EC §§ 44260.8 and 44277 which are redundant references for the health education and CPR requirements.

Section 80036.2

(a)(1): Subsection added to differentiate between the experience and education combinations available to qualify for the preliminary full-time/part-time adult education teaching credentials and the new three-year preliminary adult education teaching credentials. This subsection provides the experience and education combinations related to §§80036(a) and 80036.1(a).

(a)(2): Subsection added to provide the experience and education combinations related to the three-year preliminary adult education teaching credentials issued pursuant to §80036.4. Since only three years of experience or a combination of education and experience are required, the combinations in the table have been adjusted to match.

(c): Section amended to add ‘certificate’ as an option to qualify for the academic subject of English as a Second Language (ESL) and moved the ‘regionally accredited college or university’ language to indicate that the degree, certificate or course work must be completed at such an institution.

(c)(3): Deleted English from the list to qualify for the academic subject of English as a Second Language (ESL) as recommended by the advisory panel and renumbered subsection (4) to (3).

(c)(4): Renumbered from (c)(5) due to the deletion of English.

(c)(5): Renumbered from (c)(6) due to the deletion of English.

(c)(6): Renumbered from (c)(7) due to the deletion of English, deleted teaching reading from the list to qualify for the academic subject of ESL and added second language acquisition to the list as recommended by the advisory panel.

(c)(8): Deleted speech from the list to qualify for the academic subject of ESL as recommended by the advisory panel.

Section 80036.3

(a): Deleted ‘LEAs’ (a term that is no longer used) and ‘ESDs’ (who will no longer have the authority to submit adult education applications to the Commission for processing) and added ‘Commission-approved program of personalized preparation’ (current program term as defined in §80034).

The new Career Technical Education and Personal Development categories along with the lists of general subjects that fall within each category added to the table in this section. The general subjects for these two new categories will only be available on three-year preliminary and clear adult education teaching credentials issued pursuant to §80036.4.

(b): Amended ‘from time to time’ at the beginning of this section to ‘as needed’ for clarity.

Section 80036.4

This section has been added to outline the requirements for the three-year preliminary and clear adult education teaching credentials issued pursuant to AB 1374.

(a): Establishes the initial issuance date for the three-year preliminary adult education teaching credential and explains that the three-year preliminary adult education teaching credentials are

available in any academic subject area or any general subjects that fall under the new Career Technical Education and Personal Development categories.

(a)(1): Explains the experience and/or education requirement for the three-year preliminary adult education teaching credential, establishes the recency requirement for any experience used to qualify for a general subjects area(s), and allows alternatives in lieu of two of the three years of experience.

(a)(1)(A): Allows for the acceptance of an advanced industry certificate (as determined by a Commission-approved program) in lieu of one year of experience for general subjects.

(a)(1)(B): Allows for acceptance of one year full-time teaching experience earned while holding a general education teaching credential in lieu of one year of experience for general subjects.

(a)(2): Indicates that a high school diploma or the equivalent as defined in §80034(f) is required for issuance of a three-year preliminary adult education teaching credential.

(a)(3): Explains the basic skills requirement for adult education credentials and the exemptions to the requirement.

(a)(4) and (a)(6): Indicate that the three-year preliminary adult education teaching credential application must be submitted by a Commission-approved program.

(a)(5): Language to reference the required application form and processing fee required when applying for a three-year preliminary adult education teaching credential. (c) "~~Local Education Agency~~" (LEA) "Commission-approved program of personalized preparation" ~~as it applies to designated subjects credentials~~, means any of the following categories of agencies which are authorized to develop, submit and implement a ~~Commission-approved program of personalized preparation, as listed in Sections 80040.2, 80040.2.5 and 80042~~ for designated subjects adult education teaching credentials:

(1) A California public school district or consortium of school districts;

(2) A California county superintendent of schools office;

(3) A California regional occupation program or center;

(4) A California State Agency;

(5) A Commission-approved teacher preparation institution;

(6) A Charter School as established in Education Code Section 47605.

(1) a diploma based on passage of the General Education Development Test; or

(2) the foreign equivalent to the high school diploma which is a diploma, certificate, or the title awarded to mark the completion of a program normally requiring twelve years of schooling, or required for admission to an institution of higher education. ~~Examples of such foreign equivalents are listed in the "Placement Recommendation" of the American~~

~~Association of College Registrars and Admission Officers' "World Education Series," and the U.N.E.S.C.O. "World Survey of Education, IV, Higher Education".~~

- ~~(h) "Work experience," as it applies to designated subjects vocational education teaching credentials, means full-time or part-time experience directly related to the subject to be named on the credential. Work experience may be paid or not paid. No more than one year of work experience shall apply toward meeting designated subjects credential requirements during any twelve calendar month period. 1500 clock hours shall be the minimum required for each year of work experience. Part-time work experience may be cumulated to equate to the required 1500 clock hours of work experience.~~
- ~~(i) "Vocational teaching experience" means experience as a teacher or instructor of the specific subject to be named on the credential in any course that is intended to result in the entry-level employment of the students enrolled in that course. One class hour of vocational teaching experience is equal to one clock hour of work experience.~~
- ~~(j) "College level related coursework" means postsecondary coursework that is offered by an accredited college or university that directly relates to the subject to be named on the credential. One semester unit of college or university coursework, for the purpose of computing work experience for the designated subjects vocational education credential only, equates to sixty-two and one-half (62 1/2) clock hours.~~
- ~~(k) "Non-college related coursework" means coursework, workshops, or seminars offered by an agency other than an accredited college or university that provides upgrading or development of skills directly related to the subject to be named on the credential. One class hour of non-college related coursework is equal to one clock hour of work experience.~~
- ~~(l) "Occupational internship" means a planned occupational experience offered by an educational agency in cooperation with an employer designed to provide the intern with depth, breadth and expertise in the subject to be named on the credential. One class hour of occupational internship experience is equal to one clock hour of work experience.~~
- ~~(m) "Supervised occupational student teaching" means a planned course of instruction that is approved by the Commission and offered by an LEA for the purpose of providing the student teacher with depth, breadth and expertise in pedagogical skills through actual classroom teaching experience in an occupational program or programs in the public schools. Such occupational student teaching shall be offered by the LEA if there is an appropriate course or program available where the supervised occupational student teaching may occur. § 80036.4. Specific Requirements for and Authorization of the Designated Subjects Three-Year Preliminary and Clear Adult Education Teaching Credentials.

- (a) Effective January 1, 2011, the minimum requirements for the issuance of an initial three-year preliminary adult education teaching credential in an academic subject area(s) specified in Section 80034(a) or a subject(s) within the general subjects Career Technical Education and/or Personal Development categories listed in Section 80036.3 shall include all of the following:

- (1) Verification of three years of experience and/or education related to each subject to be named on the credential. The experience and/or education shall meet the criteria specified in Section 80036.2. For a general subjects area(s), one year of the required experience shall be within the last five years, or two years within the last ten years, immediately preceding the issuance of the three-year preliminary credential. One or more of the following may be used for up to a maximum of two of the three years of experience:

(A) Possession of an advanced industry certificate related to the subject to be named on the preliminary credential as determined by a Commission-approved program may be used as one year of work experience;

(B) One year of full-time teaching experience providing instructional services in preschool or grades K-12 earned in a public or private school of equivalent status while holding a general education teaching credential based on completion of a teacher preparation program and student teaching may be used as one year of work experience.

- (2) Verification of a high school diploma or the equivalent;

(3) Meet the basic skills requirement as specified in Education Code Section 44252. Applicants for an adult education teaching credential authorizing the teaching of adults in an apprenticeship program, approved by the Apprenticeship Standards Division of the Department of Industrial Relations, or in a general subjects area(s) are exempt from this requirement.

(4) Verification that the applicant has been apprised of the requirements for the clear credential, including requirements of the program of personalized preparation;

(5) Submission of a completed Application for Credential Authorizing Public School Service as specified in Section 80001; the fee as specified in Section 80487(a)(1); and

verification of completion of livescan, unless clearance is already on file with the Commission.

(6) Recommendation from a Commission-approved program of personalized preparation on a form approved by the Commission.

(b) The minimum requirements for the clear adult education teaching credential shall include all of the following:

(1) A valid preliminary adult education teaching credential;

(2) Completion of a Commission-approved program of personalized preparation;

(3) Completion of one of the following:

(A) two years of successful teaching on the basis of the preliminary adult education teaching credential in the subject area(s) listed; or

(B) completion of a Commission-approved program of advanced personalized preparation.

(4) Verification of knowledge of the Constitution of the United States, as specified in Education Code Section 44335, by one of the means described in Section 80415;

(5) The study of health education as specified in Education Code Section 44259(c)(4)(A);

(6) The study of computer-based technology, including the uses of technology in educational settings.

(7) Submission of a completed Application for Credential Authorizing Public School Service as specified in Section 80001 and the fee as specified in Section 80487(a)(1).

(8) Recommendation from a Commission-approved program of personalized preparation on a form approved by the Commission.

(c) Authorization. The preliminary or clear adult education teaching credential authorizes the holder to teach the subject(s) named on the credential as specified in Section 80036.3 in courses organized primarily for adults.

(d) Period of Validity. The period of validity of the preliminary and clear career technical education teaching credentials shall be as follows:

(1) A preliminary adult education teaching credential issued on the basis of the applicant's satisfaction of all requirements in subsection (a) shall be valid for three years;

(2) A clear adult education teaching credential issued on the basis of the applicant's satisfaction of all requirements specified in subsection (b) shall be valid for five years.

~~A preliminary Designated Subjects Adult Education Teaching Credential or a preliminary Designated Subjects Vocational Education Teaching Credential which was issued prior to effective date of this Section shall remain in force as it is valid and shall be renewed, provided all requirements for renewal are met in accordance with the requirements that were in effect at the time that credential was issued.~~
