# Program Approval

## **Introduction**

This agenda item presents four single subject matter program submitted by institutions of higher education for approval.

## **Background**

The Commission regularly receives recommendations for program approval from single subject matter review panels. These panels of subject matter experts review all program documentation and make an informed determination whether the program meets the standards common to all subject matter programs and also the content specific subject matter standards. The content specific subject matter standards are closely aligned to the K-12 academic content standards. These subject matter programs are usually undergraduate courses of study completed before candidates begin teacher preparation programs. However, the two programs may be completed concurrently.

## **Subject Matter Program Review Procedures**

Following are the general procedures for the review of subject matter programs:

1. Technical Assistance – After the Commission adopts a set of new program standards, Commission staff members provide technical assistance to prospective program sponsors wishing to submit responses to the new standards. Technical assistance materials are provided on the Commission’s website. Staff members train, assign, and coordinate review team work.
2. Preconditions Review – After the program proposal is received, Commission staff review the sponsor’s response to the preconditions. The preconditions are based on both state laws and Commission policies, and address minimum unit and content area requirements. If the preconditions response is incomplete, the sponsor is requested to provide specific information necessary for compliance with the preconditions.
3. Program Review – The program sponsor’s responses to the Commission’s subject matter program standards are reviewed by a team of two or more subject matter educators to determine if the program meets the program standards, including the subject matter requirements (SMRs). The SMRs are the content knowledge required to be covered in the program and are aligned to the K-12 content standards that the candidate will be expected to know. The reviewers are trained in the alignment of the standards and subject matter requirements and in the review process before they are assigned proposals to review. Reviewers are instructed to find explicit evidence that programs not only align with K-12 content standards but also introduce their candidates to those standards within the

context of their subject matter studies. The team must reach consensus that each standard is met based upon evidence provided in the document. If the program does not meet the standards, the sponsor is given an explanation of the findings. The sponsor may then submit the additional information requested. Once reviewers determine that the program proposal provides a convincing and adequate body of evidence to meet the Commission's adopted subject matter program standards, the program is recommended to the Commission for approval.

4. After subject matter program approval is granted by the Commission, the institution may admit candidates to the approved subject matter program. Graduates of a Commission approved single subject matter preparation program meet the Commission's subject matter requirement and are not required to take the subject matter examination (California Subject Examinations for Teachers).

This report presents four single subject matter programs are deemed to have met all of the appropriate *Standards of Quality and Effectiveness for Single Subject Matter Preparation Programs* ([www.ctc.ca.gov/educator-prep/STDS-subject-matter.html](http://www.ctc.ca.gov/educator-prep/STDS-subject-matter.html)) by appropriate review panels and are recommended to the Commission for approval. The programs brought forward to the Commission for approval at this time are: California Polytechnic State University, Pomona: Languages Other Than English (Spanish); California State University, Dominguez Hills: Languages Other Than English (Spanish); California State University, Channel Islands: Foundational-Level Mathematics; California Lutheran University: Social Science.

### **Summary Information on the Single Subject Matter Programs**

#### **California Polytechnic State University, Pomona: Languages Other Than English (Spanish)**

The Spanish Language program falls under the purview of the department of English and Foreign Language (EFL) in the College of Letters, Arts and Social Sciences at Cal Poly Pomona and is endorsed by the College of Education and Integrative Studies. The College of Letters, Arts, and Social Sciences designs its programs so as to provide students with lifelong learning skills which will enable them to intelligently confront and solve challenges that arise while working and living in a complex, evolving, and increasingly diverse yet interconnected society. These skills include creative and critical thinking; qualitative and quantitative methods of inquiry; the use of theory in practice, as well as the modification of theory based on that practice; and the capacity to learn through performance-based activities in the humanities, arts, and social sciences. The design of the Spanish Language Program shows consistency with the *World Language Content Standards for California Public Schools: Kindergarten Through Grade Twelve* (2009) through its coverage of all of the foundational language areas, namely literature, language, and culture, and through the further development and assessment of each student's grasp of those areas in the required capstone course. The Spanish Subject Matter Program's learning outcomes are:

- To communicate orally in Spanish in real-life situations at the ACTFL advanced high proficiency level
- To communicate in writing in Spanish at the ACTFL advanced high proficiency level with minimal errors in grammar, spelling, and the mechanics of writing
- Read critically, interpret analytically, and write coherently about literatures produced

- in Spanish and demonstrate knowledge about fundamental principles of the Spanish language
- To understand and demonstrate appreciation of the cultural values of Spanish-speaking peoples

#### California State University, Dominguez Hills: Languages Other Than English (Spanish)

The Subject Matter Preparation Program in Spanish (SMPPS) at CSU, Dominguez Hills was designed by department faculty with a range of scholarly preparation in Peninsular literature, Spanish American literature, Spanish linguistics and Spanish and Spanish American history/culture. The program's courses can be grouped into the areas of language acquisition, history and culture, linguistics and literature which reflect the *World Languages Content Standards for California Public Schools: Kindergarten Through Grade Twelve* (2009). Planned for future teachers, it goes beyond what is required for the regular Spanish major. The program's philosophy is based on the principle that effective Spanish teachers must be able to teach different levels of Spanish to students with various learning styles and proficiencies in Spanish. The SMPPS produces graduates with an advanced competency in speaking, reading and writing university Spanish, as well as a basic knowledge of Spanish and Spanish American culture and literature, and linguistics to enter a secondary school classroom with poise and an eagerness to teach successfully. Student learning outcomes include the following:

- An advanced level of speaking, writing, and reading on a variety of topics
- An ability to apply the major theories of language to the description of the phonological, syntactical, morphological, semantic and syntactic levels of the Spanish language
- An awareness of the examples of Spanish and Spanish American literature from selected historical periods
- An awareness of general patterns and/or themes in Spanish and Spanish American history, culture, and literature
- An ability to know how and where to seek out new information from multiple sources and interweave or synthesize it with prior knowledge
- An ability to consider ideas or issues from a different cultural perspective
- An appreciation of the cultural achievements and contributions of Spain and Spanish America
- Understanding of the importance of Spanish as a heritage language and a basis for introducing new knowledge
- Understanding of the importance of being able to communicate in two or more languages
- An attitude of observation and respect regarding cultural, racial, linguistic and religious diversity

#### California State University, Channel Islands: Foundational-Level Mathematics

The Foundational-Level Mathematics (FLM) Program at CSU, Channel Islands shares foundational mathematics course with the Mathematics Subject Matter program. The FLM Program also includes upper division courses specially designed for teaching mathematics and electives applied mathematics courses, such as physics and computer sciences. Candidate outcomes for FLM are consistent with those found in the approved Mathematics Subject Matter Programs for foundational coursework.

### California Lutheran University: Social Science

Candidates for a Single Subject Teaching Credential in History-Social Science demonstrate the ability to teach the subject matter consistent with the *History-Social Science Content Standards for California Public Schools: Kindergarten Through Grade Twelve* (1998). Candidates understand how social science concepts and themes provide insights into historical periods and cultures as well as current and future issues. They understand events and periods from multiple perspectives through using simulations, case studies, cultural artifacts, works of art and literature, cooperative projects and student research activities. They are knowledgeable in selecting and using appropriate primary and secondary documents and artifacts to understand historical periods, events, regions and cultures. Candidates engage in and reflect on discussion of sensitive issues (e.g., social, cultural, religious, race and gender issues), illustrate multiple viewpoints on issues, and recognize positions of prejudice and stereotypes. Global learning outcomes include:

- Proficiency in analytical and critical thinking and to be able to process, transform, and communicate information
- Understanding of themselves as both heirs and creators of history in order to understand the forces that have shaped their cultural heritage and to encounter others whose experiences lie beyond the boundaries of their particular nation or culture
- Ability to comprehend issues from a variety of perspectives and to understand how one's perspective shapes the questions one asks about the world and the types of answers one seeks
- Ability to integrate information and perspectives in order to develop creative solutions to new problems
- Involvement in building and sustaining the communities they live in

### **Recommendations**
