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# Program Approval

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## **Introduction**

This agenda item presents eight single subject matter programs submitted by institutions of higher education for approval.

## **Background**

The Commission regularly receives recommendations for program approval from single subject matter review panels. These panels of subject matter experts review all program documentation and make an informed determination whether the program meets the standards common to all subject matter programs and also the content specific subject matter standards. The content specific subject matter standards are closely aligned to the K-12 academic content standards. These subject matter programs are usually undergraduate courses of study completed before candidates begin teacher preparation programs. However, the two programs may be completed concurrently.

## **Subject Matter Program Review Procedures**

Following are the general procedures for the review of subject matter programs:

1. Technical Assistance – After the Commission adopts a set of new program standards, Commission staff members provide technical assistance to prospective program sponsors wishing to submit responses to the new standards. Technical assistance materials are provided on the Commission’s website. Staff members train, assign, and coordinate review team work.
2. Preconditions Review – After the program proposal is received, Commission staff review the sponsor’s response to the preconditions. The preconditions are based on both state laws and Commission policies, and address minimum unit and content area requirements. If the preconditions response is incomplete, the sponsor is requested to provide specific information necessary for compliance with the preconditions.
3. Program Review – The program sponsor’s responses to the Commission’s subject matter program standards are reviewed by a team of two or more subject matter educators to determine if the program meets the program standards, including the subject matter requirements (SMRs). The SMRs are the content knowledge required to be covered in the program and are aligned to the K-12 content standards that the candidate will be expected to know. The reviewers are trained in the alignment of the standards and subject matter requirements and in the review process before they are assigned proposals to review. Reviewers are instructed to find explicit evidence that programs not only align with K-12 content standards but also introduce their candidates to those standards within the context of their subject matter studies. The team must reach consensus that each standard is met based upon evidence provided in the document. If the program does not meet the standards, the sponsor is given an explanation of the findings.

The sponsor may then submit the additional information requested. Once reviewers determine that the program proposal provides a convincing and adequate body of evidence to meet the Commission's adopted subject matter program standards, the program is recommended to the Commission for approval.

4. After subject matter program approval is granted by the Commission, the institution may admit candidates to the approved subject matter program. Graduates of a Commission approved single subject matter preparation program meet the Commission's subject matter requirement and are not required to take the subject matter examination (California Subject Examinations for Teachers).

This report presents eight single subject matter programs are deemed to have met all of the appropriate *Standards of Quality and Effectiveness for Single Subject Matter Preparation Programs* ([www.ctc.ca.gov/educator-prep/STDS-subject-matter.html](http://www.ctc.ca.gov/educator-prep/STDS-subject-matter.html)) by appropriate review panels and are recommended to the Commission for approval. The programs brought forward to the Commission for approval at this time are: California State University, Long Beach: Health; California State University, Fresno: Business; Sonoma State University: Foundational-Level Mathematics; Sonoma State University: Music; Azusa Pacific University: Music; La Verne University: Foundational Level General Science; California State University, East Bay: Foundational-Level Mathematics; San Diego State University: Foundational-Level General Science.

### **Summary Information on the Single Subject Matter Programs**

#### California State University, Long Beach: Health

The philosophy of the Health Science Credential Program (HSCP) is consistent with the *Health Education Content Standards for California Public Schools: Kindergarten through Grade Twelve* (2008). This program is designed to develop effective health science teachers who are reflective practitioners, have mastered the content areas of health and are able to link content and pedagogy. These practitioners are able to integrate research, theory and best educational practices into teaching health. A skilled health science teacher has a broad general education and a broad and deep understanding of health science content. Program outcomes include:

- Analysis of the effects of tobacco/alcohol/drugs on the individual and society and determine effective prevention and education strategies.
- Assessment of risk factors for lifestyle-related health conditions and injuries.
- Evaluation of the role of nutrition and physical activity in maintaining overall health and well-being.
- Knowledge of human sexuality from biological, psychological, sociological, cultural, economic and scientific perspectives.
- Understanding of the importance of the Coordinated School Health Program in promoting health.
- Development of functional knowledge to promote personal, environmental, consumer and community health.
- Understanding of the importance of mental, emotional and social health and the interrelationships among these concepts.

#### California State University, Fresno: Business

Teachers of business prepared at California State University, Fresno are grounded in the field of business and economic education. They are able to teach all areas of business and business

economics which are commonly taught at the secondary level. All business teacher education candidates complete coursework in accounting, business law, economics, entrepreneurship, finance, information systems, marketing, management, and statistics. The program prepares teachers to be reflective thinkers, problem solvers, and decision makers prepared to respond to and meet the challenges in our regional and statewide community. The program imparts knowledge of historical events, current research, and recent developments in business; social, economic, legal, and ethical issues in the field; strategies for staying abreast of current issues and developments in business, and industry trends and job opportunities, employer expectations, and personal characteristics (e.g., appropriate work habits, social and communication skills) necessary for a successful career in business. Candidates understand the importance of technology, reading, writing, mathematics, speaking, and active listening skills and how to apply this knowledge in a variety of business situations. Business teacher education candidate outcomes include the abilities to:

- Understand and effectively communicate the central role that business plays in the lives of all individuals.
- Understand the skills, attitudes, and knowledge that students need to complete and succeed in a rapidly changing global marketplace.
- Apply critical thinking and creativity to investigate and solve business-related problems.
- Understand how to collect and analyze business information, make business decisions, and implement those decisions by communicating and interacting effectively in a diverse workplace.
- Understand the organizational team, leadership, and communication skills needed to work effectively with business and community leaders.
- Understand the fundamentals of supervising, advising, and supporting people.
- Understand the characteristics, functions, and organizational structures of leadership organizations.
- Effectively network in individual and group settings in educational institutions, the community, and industry.
- Understand the need to include all stakeholders and are able to respond to issues related to diversity and equity in business.

#### Sonoma State University: Foundational-Level Mathematics

The Foundational-Level Mathematics (FLM) Program at Sonoma State University shares foundational mathematics courses with their approved Mathematics Subject Matter program. The FLM Program also includes upper division courses specially designed for teaching mathematics and elective applied mathematics courses, such as physics and computer sciences. Candidate outcomes for FLM are consistent with those found in the approved Mathematics Subject Matter Programs for foundational coursework.

#### Sonoma State University: Music

The Single Subject Matter Preparation Program in Music at Sonoma State University is dedicated to the training and development of prospective teachers to become successful music educators in California public schools. The Program is aimed at developing future teachers who are competent musicians and performers in their own right, and who can effectively communicate and teach music to a diverse student population. Candidates in the program experience first-hand the tenets of artistic perception, creative expression, cultural and historical contexts, aesthetic valuing, and connections, relationships, and applications in their individual major performing ensembles on their instrument or voice. These values are an inherent part of

the scholarly level of preparation and delivery of instruction by our university ensemble directors. The program is comprised of a comprehensive core of coursework designed to establish a strong foundation in:

- Personal musicianship and performance skills in vocal and instrumental music.
- Music theory and music history.
- Proficient piano keyboard skills.
- Sight singing and sight reading skills.
- Improvisation skills.
- Communication and conducting skills.
- Skills associated with analyzing and describing music.
- Basic composing and arranging skills.
- Diverse multicultural musical types and styles.
- Technologies associated with music.
- Appropriate repertoire associated with various levels and types of instrumental and vocal ensembles, and elementary classroom music.
- Performance and pedagogical skills associated with methods in woodwind, strings, brass, and percussion instruments, guitar, and voice.
- Current trends in music education.
- Active participation in professional music education organizations and the need for continuous professional development.

#### Azusa Pacific University: Music

Azusa Pacific University School of Music's music education emphasis provides future vocal, instrumental, and general music teachers with necessary skills, knowledge, and appropriate methodologies for success at all levels of music education within California. The School of Music Education Subject matter preparation program at Azusa Pacific University is based upon the belief that all teachers of music in grades K-12 must have an understanding of the ability of music to generate and encourage growth and beauty in their own lives and its potential to positively affect similar changes in the lives of their students in the public schools of California.

Prospective teachers are aware of how music integrates many aspects of the liberal arts curriculum, including Language, Physical Science, Social Science, Behavioral Science, Mathematics, History and other domains of The Arts. The music program prepares candidates who are knowledgeable in all areas of music education curriculum, including instrumental, vocal, historical, ethnological, theoretical and technological cognates. Candidates in the program learn how to analyze and appreciate the broad spectrum of musical styles that characterize their own as well as their students' daily interactions with music. Additionally, the awareness and understanding of ethnically and culturally diverse peoples of California's public schools is mandatory. Candidates who complete the music education program are expected to achieve the following outcomes:

- Highly developed aural musicianship and aural analysis skills and have acquired knowledge of written music theory and analysis.
- Expressive and skillful performance on a primary instrument or voice and demonstrate basic proficiency in keyboard skills, conducting techniques, sight singing and reading, improvisation, composing and arranging music.
- Knowledge of Western and selected non-Western music and apply this knowledge to analyze musical works.

- Understanding of aesthetic valuing in music, broad and deep conceptual knowledge of music and the ability to respond to, analyze and critique performances and works of music, including their own.
- Understanding of the connections and relationships between music and the other arts as well as between music and other academic disciplines and familiarity with the broad range of career and lifelong learning opportunities available in the field of music, the media and the entertainment industries.
- Understanding of teaching techniques and repertoire evaluation for general, instrumental, and choral music classes.

La Verne University: Foundational Level General Science

The Foundational-Level General Science (FLGS) Program at La Verne University includes all of the general science courses in their approved Science Subject Matter program. The FLGS Program also includes upper division courses specially designed for teaching science. Candidate outcomes for FLGS are consistent with those found in the approved Science Subject Matter Programs for general science coursework.

California State University, East Bay: Foundational-Level Mathematics

The Foundational-Level Mathematics (FLM) Program at California State University, East Bay shares foundational mathematics courses with their approved Mathematics Subject Matter program. The FLM Program also includes upper division courses specially designed for teaching mathematics and elective applied mathematics courses, such as physics and computer sciences. Candidate outcomes for FLM are consistent with those found in the approved Mathematics Subject Matter Programs for foundational coursework.

San Diego State University: Foundational-Level General Science

The Foundational-Level General Science (FLGS) Program at San Diego University (SDSU) is housed in the Liberal Studies Department and independent of their approved Science Subject Matter Program. However, the Natural Science Program Coordinator/Advisor maintains oversight of the program and its candidates as with the Science Subject Matter Programs at SDSU. The FLGS Program contains a set of general science courses in biology, physics, chemistry, and geosciences which meet the requirements for FLGS. This program provides an opportunity for liberal studies majors to qualify and apply for both multiple subject and FLGS credentials.

**Recommendations**

Based upon a determination by reviewers that the following entities have met all relevant standards and requirements, staff recommends Commission approval of the following subject matter programs:

- California State University, Long Beach: Health
- California State University, Fresno: Business
- Sonoma State University: Foundational-Level Mathematics
- Sonoma State University: Music
- Azusa Pacific University: Music
- La Verne University: Foundational Level General Science
- California State University, East Bay: Foundational-Level Mathematics
- San Diego State University: Foundational-Level General Science
