In The Beginning...

Based on findings of a statewide study of certificated staff, the Commission sponsored Senate Bill 435 in 1987

Established EC §44258.9

Effective 1/1/1988



Annual Assignment Monitoring and Reporting

- ◆ All teaching and non-teaching assignments
 - One-fourth of certificated staff in county
 - Decile 1, 2, and 3 [2009 base Academic Performance Index (API)] schools (*unless under state or federal review or clear for 2 years*)
- ◆ English Learner (EL) Data Collection in Decile 1, 2, and 3 (2009 API) schools
- ◆ Monitoring and Reporting excludes charter schools



Charter Schools

- ◆ Education Code §47605(1) - Teachers in charter schools are required to hold a Commission issued certificate, permit, or other document equivalent to a teacher in other public schools (*flexibility for noncore, non-college preparatory courses*)
- ◆ Authority to verify that an educator holds appropriate credential and/or authorization for assignment falls under the chartering authority
- ◆ Assignments are subject to periodic inspection by the charter authority (Periodic inspection is not further defined in statute or regulation)



Misassignment (Unauthorized Assignment)


- ◆ “Misassignment” is defined in Education Code §33126(b)(5)(B) and clarified in Title 5 §80339(f)
- ◆ Placement of a certificated employee in a teaching or services position for which the employee does not hold a legally recognized certificate, credential, permit, or waiver with an appropriate authorization for the assignment or is not legally authorized for the assignment under another section of statute or regulations

- ◆ 10,176 assignments reported under the five most common options
- ◆ 56% of assignments under these Education Codes are in the four core areas of English, social science, math and science

- ◆ Revisions made to Assignment Monitoring Reports issued in 2008 and 2010 to correct the first year of misassignment data reported for schools ranked in Deciles 1 through 3 in 2005-2006 (2003 base API)



Correction to Misassignment Data Reported for 2005-2006

- ◆ Error identified in the 2005-2006 Misassignment data reported for schools ranked in Deciles 1 through 3 (2003 base API) due to system duplication
- ◆ 2005-2006 represents the first year of baseline misassignment data for these school sites
- ◆ Enhancements created to identify duplicate data entered into future databases and an additional tool to check all data for system duplication
