

Teaching and Services Permits History

- ◆ Emergency Teaching and Services Credentials issued until 1994
- ◆ Bachelor's or higher degree not required until 1985
- ◆ Statement of Need form required with each permit application until 1994
- ◆ No limit on the number of permit reissuances until 1998
- ◆ Emergency Multiple Subject, Single Subject, and Education Specialist replaced by STSPs and PIPs in 2005



Current Teaching and Services Permits

- 1) Emergency Crosscultural, Language and Academic Development (CLAD)
- 2) Emergency Bilingual
- 3) Emergency Resource Specialist (RSP)
- 4) Emergency Teacher Librarian Services
- 5) Visiting Faculty Permit



Emergency Teaching and Services Permits

- ◆ Available at the request of, and restricted to service with, a California public school employer
- ◆ Issued in one year increments
- ◆ May be reissued four times



Common Emergency Permit Requirements - Candidates

- ◆ Bachelor's degree
- ◆ Basic Skills Requirement (BSR)
- ◆ Valid prerequisite credential or permit
- ◆ Written intent to complete reissuance requirements
- ◆ Employment with California employing agency
- ◆ Specific permit requirements



Common Emergency Permit Requirements - Employers

- ◆ File annual Declaration of Need form
- ◆ Assign experienced educator
- ◆ Provide orientation, guidance, and assistance for initial permit holders
- ◆ Provide ongoing guidance and assistance for reissued permit holders
- ◆ Submit permit applications to the Commission

Specific Emergency Permit Reissuance Requirements

- ◆ Emergency CLAD and Bilingual Permits
 - 6 semester units of approved program coursework
 - Pass two exams
 - Combination of coursework and exams
- ◆ Emergency RSP and Teacher Librarian
 - 6 semester units (or the equivalent) of approved program coursework




- ◆ Education Code §44300(a)(3) and 5 CCR §80026
- ◆ Annual form filed by employing agency estimating number of permits to be employed during a school year
- ◆ Must be approved by governing board as an action item
- ◆ Employing agency must declare that policies and practices are in place for conducting a diligent search for credentialed teacher




Emergency CLAD Permit Prerequisite Credential or Permit




Emergency CLAD Permit Upgrades

Other Permits

- ◆ Emergency RSP Permit
 - 19 new-type and 5 reissuances in 2010-11
 - 3 upgraded to Clear RSP and 1 issued Level I Education Specialist Credential

- ◆ Visiting Faculty Permit
 - Total of five VFPs issued since 2009-10
 - May not be initially issued after July 1, 2013 or renewed after July 1, 2015



Limited Assignment Permit Common Applicant Requirements

- ◆ Valid prerequisite teaching credential
- ◆ Consent to serve on permit
- ◆ Employment with California employing agency



Limited Assignment Permit Common Employer Requirements

- ◆ File annual DON form
- ◆ Assign an experienced educator to permit holder
- ◆ Submit application to the Commission



Limited Assignment Permit Common Reissuance Requirements

- ◆ Valid prerequisite teaching credential
- ◆ Consent to serve on permit
- ◆ Continued employment with California employing agency
- ◆ Valid DON form




Limited Assignment Permit Specific Reissuance Requirements


- ◆ GELAP
 - Attempt all subject-matter exams and pass at least two; or
 - 6 semester units of coursework toward supplementary, subject matter, or added authorization
- ◆ SELAP
 - 6 semester units of coursework or 90 clock hours of activities associated with an approved program




Single Subject Limited Assignment Permit Added Authorizations




Special Education Limited Assignment Permit Added Authorizations




Special Education Limited Assignment Permit Full Specialty Areas




Short-Term Staff Permits




Single Subject STSP Subject Areas




Education Specialist STSP Credentials Held

Options for Commission Consideration

- ◆ Reduce the number of emergency permit reissuances
- ◆ Require recruitment documentation with each application
- ◆ Restrict issuance of emergency permits to remote locations
- ◆ Eliminate PIP
- ◆ Eliminate PIP reissuance
- ◆ Seek statutory amendments to delete the DON
