Selection of Member for the Committee of Credentials

Introduction

At the December 2013 meeting of the Commission on Teacher Credentialing, the Commission moved to declare the school board member position vacant effective July 1, 2014. The incumbent member submitted her resignation effective December 31, 2013. The alternate member, Jane Smith, was subsequently placed in the position to serve until the term expires in July 2014.

Background

The obligations of the Commission relative to the Committee of Credentials (COC) are set forth in the Commission's Policy Manual. This item summarizes those obligations and presents information concerning the selection process for members of the COC.

The Commission and its appointed COC review individuals for fitness to receive and/or retain credentials. The COC is comprised of seven members appointed by the Commission and consists of one elementary teacher, one secondary teacher, one school board member, one school administrator, and three public representatives. The COC meets three days each month.

Selection Process

Pursuant to §501 of the Commission's Policy Manual, an Ad Hoc Interview Committee appointed by the Chair in accordance with the provisions of §§400 and 410 shall be responsible for receiving and evaluating applications and nominations for membership on the COC and for conducting interviews as appropriate; and

(a) Placing in nomination the names of qualified persons for each position to be filled. An alternate may be selected if deemed qualified. Any alternate so selected will be placed in a pool of alternates and available to fill a vacancy in that position category should the need arise.

(b) Identifying, scoring, ranking, discussing and recommending nominees for the Committee of Credentials to the Commission according to the following factors: (1) The total membership of the Committee of Credentials should be broadly representative of the community with respect to sex, ethnic and cultural background, and geographical area of residence. (2) Persons nominated should be of balanced and judicious temperament with broad understanding of, and respect for, community values and attitudes. (3) Persons nominated must be willing and able to devote the time and effort necessary to carry out the work of the Committee.

The terms of members of the COC are set forth in §503 as follows:

(a) The term for each initial appointment to the Committee of Credentials shall be two years, and no member shall serve more than four successive two-year terms.

(b) At least one new member shall be appointed each year, but in the interest of continuity and stability, not more than three members should be replaced in one year.

(c) Terms of appointment shall commence on July 1 and shall expire on June 30, except that an appointment to fill an unexpired term may be made effective upon the first day that a position becomes vacant.

The Policy Manual provides in §504 that: (a) The Commission fully recognizes the unique and valuable contribution of the Committee of Credentials to the work of the Commission; and wishes to maintain a fully effective, cooperative, and cordial working relationship between the two bodies. (b) Each Commissioner is encouraged to arrange his/her calendar so as to schedule attendance at a Committee of Credentials meeting each year in order to observe the Committee functions and to become familiar with Committee procedures. (c) The Committee Chair and/or Committee will be invited to meet with the Commission from time to time to exchange views on matters relating to disciplinary and corrective measures necessary and appropriate.

Pursuant to Commission action at the December 12-13, 2013 meeting, the school board vacancy was advertised. A final filing date of June 1, 2014 was set as the deadline for the submission of applications. There were no additional applications received.

Staff Recommendation

Because the Commission previously interviewed Ms. Smith and selected her as an alternate, and her application was the only application received, staff recommends that the Commission suspends the Policy Manual sections for selection of Committee members and appoints Jane Smith to a two-year term.

Adoption of the Washington Educator Skills Tests-Endorsements (WEST-E) Designated World Languages: Latin

Introduction

This agenda item presents a proposal for Commission adoption of the Washington Educator Skills Tests-Endorsements (WEST-E) for purposes of candidates needing to demonstrate subject matter competency in Latin.

Background

The Commission has over twenty CSET language examinations, but does not have a CSET examination in Latin. The attachment to this agenda item indicates the range of K-12 language classes reported to the California Department of Education in 2012-13, with a second table showing the corresponding CSET examinations for each of these languages. As the table shows, the only language taught in California public schools and reported on the CBEDS data for which the Commission does not have a CSET language examination is Latin.

It would be cost prohibitive for the Commission to develop a CSET: Latin examination given the small demand for Latin credential candidates. There are two subject matter preparation programs in Latin in California, at California State University, Long Beach, and San Francisco State University. These programs, however, may not be a viable option for candidates not located in these areas of the state. The Commission has received a request from a candidate seeking an initial Single Subject Credential in Latin for an examination option in order to establish subject matter competency.

Under the circumstances, it would be cost-effective for the Commission to consider adopting the use of another state's subject matter competency examination in Latin for purposes of meeting the needs of the small number of California candidates who need to demonstrate subject matter competency in Latin. However, the Commission has an interest in approving the use of an examination that meets similar high standards as exemplified in the CSET language series.

Staff has contacted the Washington Professional Educator Standards Board, and the Board is willing to allow California candidates on an as-needed basis to use the WEST-E Designated World Languages: Latin (test code 101). Staff appreciates the Washington Professional Educator Standards Board's cooperation to help meet the needs of California candidates in Latin. Candidates would register with Washington's contractor for this subject matter examination, Pearson, and would be able to take this computer-based examination at any Pearson VUE testing center in California. Scores would be reported to the candidate and provided to the Commission by Pearson.

Description of the WEST-E Designated World Languages: Latin


The WEST-E Designated World Languages: Latin was developed by Pearson using the same development process followed by the Commission for the development of the CSET series. The following information about this assessment is provided on the WEST program website (http://www.west.nesinc.com/WA_PM.asp?t=101.)

The Washington Educator Skills Tests—Endorsements™ (WEST-E™) are designed to measure a candidate’s knowledge of the subject-area content contained in the test framework for each field. All WEST-E tests are fully aligned with the state’s teacher endorsement competencies and, as applicable, the Essential Academic Learning Requirements.

This test summary describes general testing information as well as the approximate percentage of the total test score derived from each content domain. The test framework, organized by content domain, contains the objectives that define the content for the test.

The competencies measured on this examination are similar to the competencies measured by the CSET except that Oral Reading replaces Oral Expression because this is a Classical rather than a Modern Spoken language. The WEST-E Designated Languages: Latin competencies are provided in Appendix A for reference.

Staff Recommendation

Staff recommends that the Commission

- Approve the use of the Washington Educator Skills Tests-Endorsements (WEST-E) Designated World Languages: Latin for California candidates
- Adopt the passing score standard of a scale score of 240 on a scale of 100-300 established by the state of Washington for this examination
- Approve this examination as meeting the subject matter requirement in Latin for candidates who are successful on this examination

Next Steps

Working with the examinations contractor for the WEST-E, Pearson, staff would update the Commission’s examinations website to include information about this assessment for candidates seeking to use the examination route for demonstrating subject matter competency in Latin. Pearson would assist these candidates as needed to register for this examination, and would report results to the candidate and to the Commission.

- identifying the main idea of a passage

- identifying meter (e.g., hendecasyllabic, dactylic hexameter) and metrical elements (e.g., trochee, spondee, dactyl) in a passage of poetry
- recognizing a stated cause-and-effect relationship or sequence of events in a passage
- selecting an appropriate summary of a passage

0002 Apply skills of inference to Latin prose and poetry

For example:

- drawing conclusions based on information presented in a passage
- predicting the outcome of a situation described in a passage
- inferring an author's tone or mood in a passage
- inferring the theme, purpose, or intended audience of a passage

0003 Apply skills of analysis to Latin prose and poetry

For example:

- determining the cultural or political context of a passage
- analyzing an author's point of view in a passage
- analyzing the structure of an author's argument in a passage
- analyzing the role or effect of figures of speech, rhetorical devices, and features of style in a passage
- analyzing the role of organizational structures (e.g., word order, word choice, sentence length) in a passage

0004 Select an appropriate English translation of a short Latin passage

For example:

- choosing the correct translation of a short passage of Latin prose
- choosing the correct translation of a short passage of Latin poetry

LANGUAGE STRUCTURES AND COMPARISONS

0005 Understand Latin structures in context

For example:

- identifying forms (i.e., case, number, gender, person, tense, voice, mood) in a passage

- selecting an equivalent construction to express the meaning of a clause in a passage (e.g., to express purpose, cause, or time)

- selecting an appropriate construction to complete a sentence or short passage
- transforming sentences or short passages according to given instructions (e.g., transforming the tense or mood of verbs in a sentence or passage)
- selecting the single sentence that correctly combines two sentences and preserves the meaning of the original sentences (e.g., expressing a causal or temporal relationship between two sentences through use of a subordinate clause)
- selecting corrections to grammatical or syntactic errors in a sentence or short passage

0007 Understand the connections between Latin and English

For example:

- demonstrating knowledge of major works, achievements, characteristic forms, and key periods in the visual arts, architecture, and technology of Roman culture and ways in which they reflect the perspectives of Roman culture
- demonstrating knowledge of products used in daily life in Roman culture (e.g., food products, household items) and ways in which they reflect the perspectives of Roman culture

- analyzing the influence of major products of Roman culture on later cultures, including U.S. culture

0010 Understand the practices and perspectives of Roman culture

For example:

- demonstrating knowledge of characteristic features of daily life and customs in Roman culture
- demonstrating knowledge of major Roman festivals and holidays, including the practices associated with these festivals and holidays
- demonstrating knowledge of major cultural institutions and practices (e.g., educational systems, patterns of work and leisure) of Roman culture and ways in which they reflect the perspectives of Roman culture
- analyzing the influence of major practices of Roman culture on later cultures, including U.S. culture

0011 Understand major concepts related to child and adolescent development and second language acquisition

For example:

- understanding major concepts and stages of child and adolescent development
- understanding major theories of second-language acquisition and their applicability in supporting students' language development
- recognizing the individuality of language learners in the language classroom and the importance of supporting the linguistic and cognitive development of all students
- demonstrating knowledge of principles of equity, diversity, and fairness as they relate to language instruction

0012 Demonstrate knowledge of principles of instruction and assessment

For example:

- demonstrating knowledge of a variety of instructional strategies and practices for promoting the development of students' interpersonal, interpretative, and presentational communication skills and cultural knowledge
- demonstrating knowledge of strategies for differentiating instruction to meet the needs of all students

- demonstrating knowledge of current national standards and proficiency guidelines for classical language learners

- demonstrating knowledge of strategies for using assessment results to monitor student learning, encourage student reflection, report student progress, and shape instruction

0013 Demonstrate knowledge of strategies for promoting language learning within and beyond the classroom

For example:

- demonstrating knowledge of strategies for creating an inclusive classroom environment that promotes the development of all students
- demonstrating knowledge of strategies for selecting a variety of age-appropriate resources (e.g., books, technology, realia) to meet the linguistic and cultural needs of all students and foster critical and creative thinking within the classroom
- recognizing the language teacher's role as an advocate for language learning within and beyond the school environment
- demonstrating knowledge of strategies for creating connections with students' families and communities and promoting lifelong language learning beyond the classroom
- recognizing the value of professional growth and reflective practices for the continued development of professional, linguistic, and cultural knowledge
- demonstrating knowledge of strategies for identifying and using opportunities for professional growth (e.g., joining professional organizations, reading professional journals, attending conferences)

0014 Demonstrate Latin writing skills by translating English sentences or short passages into grammatically accurate and appropriate Latin

- translating English sentences or short passages that express obligation or necessity
