Division of Professional Practices Workload Report

Introduction

To increase its oversight over the work of Division of Professional Practices (DPP), in 2011 the Commission on Teacher Credentialing (Commission) directed staff to present information about DPP's workload as part of the Commission's agenda.

Highlights for the December 2015 Statistics

The Commission's dashboard reports on six key measurements in line graph form, showing both current year numbers as well as the prior year numbers for comparison purposes.

The "Total Cases" are the number of open cases within DPP, including cases in the Intake Unit, before the Committee of Credentials (Committee), pending before the Commission, and pending an administrative hearing. At the end of December the caseload was 2,518 up slightly from November. This is within the normal workload range for DPP.

"Cases Opened" are new cases received during the month, from all sources, including criminal arrest notices, district reports and educators who self-report misconduct. In December, staff opened 472 cases, which within the normal range of 400-500 cases a month.

As can be seen in the "Initial Review Cases" and the "Formal Review Cases," the Committee continues to effectively handle the large number of cases under consideration by the Committee. The numbers in these two charts reflect the number of cases reviewed by the Committee at its three-day meeting in December. The two-step process (initial review and formal review) is required by statute.







"Cases Closed" is the number of matters closed during December by Commission action, Committee action or closed by staff where the Commission has given formal delegation of authority (e.g. single alcohol offenses that do not involve schools or minors). In December, 384 cases were closed, less than the prior two months.

If an educator wants to challenge a recommendation for discipline made by the Committee, the person can request an administrative hearing. An administrative hearing is an evidentiary proceeding where an administrative law judge hears and rules on the evidence. The Commission is represented in these hearings by the Office of the Attorney General (AG). The number of cases where the AG is representing the Commission is shown in the last chart. The number of cases at the administrative hearing stage is 254. The budget for the current fiscal year significantly increased funds available to the Commission to pay for legal services at the AG's office. The ability to pay the AG for more time spent on Commission cases should reduce the number of pending AG cases during the current fiscal year.

Workload Conclusion

DPP is committed to doing high quality work and views the work in DPP as a critical public service. Both management and staff are committed to reducing the time a case is waiting for action and to continue improving work processes.

Program Approval

Introduction

This agenda item presents one single subject matter program submitted by an institution of higher education for approval.

Background

The Commission regularly receives recommendations for program approval from single subject matter review panels. These panels of subject matter experts review all program documentation and make an informed determination whether the program meets the standards common to all subject matter programs and also the content specific subject matter standards. The content specific subject matter standards are closely aligned to the K-12 academic content standards. These subject matter programs are usually undergraduate courses of study completed before candidates begin teacher preparation programs. However, the two programs may be completed concurrently.

Subject Matter Program Review Procedures

Following are the general procedures for the review of subject matter programs:

1. **Technical Assistance** – After the Commission adopts a set of new program standards, Commission staff members provide technical assistance to prospective program sponsors wishing to submit responses to the new standards. Technical assistance materials are provided on the Commission’s website. Staff members train, assign, and coordinate review team work.
2. **Preconditions Review** – After the program proposal is received, Commission staff review the sponsor’s response to the preconditions. The preconditions are based on both state laws and Commission policies, and address minimum unit and content area requirements. If the preconditions response is incomplete, the sponsor is requested to provide specific information necessary for compliance with the preconditions.
3. **Program Review** – The program sponsor’s responses to the Commission’s subject matter program standards are reviewed by a team of two or more subject matter educators to determine if the program meets the program standards, including the subject matter requirements (SMRs). The SMRs are the content knowledge required to be covered in the program and are aligned to the K-12 content standards that the candidate will be expected to know. The reviewers are trained in the alignment of the standards and subject matter requirements and in the review process before they are assigned proposals to review. Reviewers are instructed to find explicit evidence that programs not only align with K-12 content

standards but also introduce their candidates to those standards within the context of their subject matter studies. The team must reach consensus that each standard is met based upon evidence provided in the document. If the program does not meet the standards, the sponsor is given an explanation of the findings. The sponsor may then submit the additional information requested. Once reviewers determine that the program proposal provides a convincing and adequate body of evidence to meet the Commission's adopted subject matter program standards, the program is recommended to the Commission for approval.

4. After subject matter program approval is granted by the Commission, the institution may admit candidates to the approved subject matter program. Graduates of a Commission approved single subject matter preparation program meet the Commission's subject matter requirement and are not required to take the subject matter examination (California Subject Examinations for Teachers).

This report presents one single subject matter program that has been deemed to have met all of the appropriate *Standards of Quality and Effectiveness for Single Subject Matter Preparation Programs* (www.ctc.ca.gov/educator-prep/STDS-subject-matter.html) by an appropriate review panel and is recommended to the Commission for approval. The program brought forward to the Commission for approval at this time is: California Baptist University World Language: Spanish

Summary Information on the Proposed Single Subject Matter Program

California Baptist University World Language: Spanish

California Baptist University Single Subject Matter World Language: Spanish has been designed collaboratively by the Department of Modern Languages and Literature and the School of Education faculties. The program is structured to meet the needs of future secondary Spanish teachers and prepare them for teaching students who attend California public schools.

The program provides students with 33 units of advanced coursework that includes language, culture, linguistics, literature and other related subjects commonly taught in California public schools. These advanced courses are all taught in the primary language of Spanish. The coursework provides additional depth and breadth study in Spanish in Literary and Professional Studies in the Spanish Language; Writing and Second Language Acquisition; and Literature. The culminating assessment for the program is a capstone project where students demonstrate mastery of the linguistic, literary, and cultural knowledge acquired throughout their course of studies in the Spanish program.

Recommendations

Based upon a determination by reviewers that the following entity has met all relevant standards and requirements, staff recommends Commission approval of the following subject matter program: California Baptist University World Language: Spanish.

Proposed Revisions to Common Standard 3

Introduction

This agenda item presents proposed revised language to the adopted Common Standards to align with the adopted Preliminary Multiple and Single Subject Teacher Preparation Program Standards for Commission approval.

Background

The Commission's Common Standards apply to all institutions approved to offer educator preparation programs leading to a California credential and are intended to ensure the successful implementation of all educator preparation programs offered by an institution. The Common Standards complement the program standards which are designed to address the program specific requirements for each credential program. In October 2015, the Commission adopted new Common Standards as part of the comprehensive effort to strengthen and streamline the accreditation system.

Subsequently, in December 2015, the Commission adopted new program standards for Preliminary Multiple and Single Subject Teacher Preparation programs. The Commission's Preliminary Multiple and Single Subject Teacher Preparation Program Standards apply to institutions approved to offer educator preparation programs leading to a California Preliminary Multiple or Single Subject credential and are intended to ensure the successful implementation of the program. The adopted standards include language which removed "public school setting" and replaced with "a diverse school setting where the curriculum aligns with California's adopted content standards and frameworks and the school reflects the diversity of California's student population." As a result of the adopted language to program standards, staff proposes revisions to the adopted Common Standards.

Proposed Changes to Common Standard Language to Align with Adopted Preliminary Multiple and Single Subject Teacher Preparation Program Standards

To align with the adopted language of the Preliminary Multiple and Single Subject Teacher Preparation Program Standards in December 2015, Commission staff proposes that Common Standard 3 be revised as follows:

Standard 3: Course of Study, Fieldwork and Clinical Practice

The unit designs and implements a planned sequence of coursework and clinical experiences for candidates to develop and demonstrate the knowledge and skills to educate and support P-12 students in meeting state-adopted content standards.

The unit and its programs offer a high-quality course of study focused on the knowledge and skills expected of beginning educators and grounded in current research on effective practice. Coursework is integrated closely with field experiences to provide candidates

with a cohesive and comprehensive program that allows candidates to learn, practice, and demonstrate competencies required of the credential they seek.

The unit and all programs collaborate with their partners regarding the criteria and selection of clinical personnel, site-based supervisors and school sites, as appropriate to the program.

- Through site-based work and clinical experiences, programs offered by the unit provide candidates with opportunities to both experience issues of diversity that affect school climate and to effectively implement research-based strategies for improving teaching and student learning.
- Site-based supervisors must be certified and experienced in teaching the specified content or performing the services authorized by the credential
- The process and criteria result in the selection of site-based supervisors who provide effective and knowledgeable support for candidates.
- Site-based supervisors are trained in supervision, oriented to the supervisory role, evaluated and recognized in a systematic manner.
- All programs effectively implement and evaluate fieldwork and clinical practice.
- For each program the unit offers, candidates have significant experience in [school settings where the curriculum aligns with California’s adopted content standards and frameworks and the school reflects the diversity of California’s student population](#) ~~California public schools with diverse student populations~~ and the opportunity to work with the range of students identified in the program standards.

Recommendation

Staff recommends the Commission adopt revisions to Common Standard 3 to align with the adopted language in the Preliminary Multiple and Single Subject Teacher Preparation Program Standards by removing “California public schools with diverse student populations” and replacing with “a diverse school setting where the curriculum aligns with California’s adopted content standards and frameworks and the school reflects the diversity of California’s student population.” This recommendation aligns with action taken by the Commission at the December 2015 meeting.

Proposed Amendments and Additions to Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations Pertaining to the Supplementary Authorization in Computer Science

Introduction

This rulemaking action proposes amendments to §§80057.5 and 80089.2 of Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations (5 CCR) related to the Supplementary Authorization in Computer Science as approved by the Commission at the October 2015 meeting.

Background

The Commission on Teacher Credentialing (Commission) conducted a public hearing on October 9, 2015 ([Agenda Item 1i](#)) and took action to approve proposed amendments to 5 CCR pertaining to the Supplementary Authorization in Computer Science. A partial approval of the proposed amendments was received on December 14, 2015. A 15-Day Notice was distributed on January 7, 2016 covering the period from January 8, 2016 to January 22, 2016, providing a supplement to the Initial Statement of Reasons that includes additional rationale and modifications to regulation text of §§80057.5 and 80089.2 for added clarity as to the necessity of the proposed changes, as requested by the Office of Administrative Law (OAL). The Commission received no public responses to the 15-Day Notice. The 15-Day notice with the final amended regulation text may be found on the Commission's website using this link:

Recommendation

Staff recommends that the Commission adopt the proposed amendments to §§80057.5 and 80089.2 of Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations pertaining the Supplementary Authorization in Computer Science, including the modified text as required for submission to the OAL.
