Requirements for the Level I Education Specialist Teaching Credential:

- Include this checklist;
- Confirmation coversheet (this will be available for printing after you complete Step 2 of the Online Direct Application Process);
- Specify requested disability area(s); Go to list of Disability Areas

- Original detailed foreign transcript evaluation showing completion of a bachelor's or higher degree deemed to be equivalent to a degree earned at a regionally-accredited institution in the United States. See leaflet [CL-635](#) for foreign transcript evaluation information;
- Original detailed foreign transcript evaluation showing completion of a professional preparation program in special education, consisting of a minimum of 24 semester units including student teaching. See leaflet [CL-635](#) for foreign transcript evaluation information;

- Issued or eligible for a comparable teaching credential earned in a country other than the United States. A statement of on your foreign transcript evaluation that you are eligible to teach in the public schools of the country where you completed your program will satisfy this requirement. See leaflet [CL-635](#) for foreign transcript evaluation information;

- Previously applied for California credential, certificate or permit and have completed the Commission fingerprint requirement; and

Authorization

The Education Specialist Instruction Credential authorizes the holder to teach in the area of specialization listed on the credential in the following settings: special day classes, special schools, home/hospital settings, correctional facilities, nonpublic schools and agencies, and resource rooms.

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Table 1: Disability Areas

<i>Mild/Moderate Disabilities (M/M)</i>	Includes specific learning disabilities; mild to moderate mental retardation; attention deficit and attention deficit hyperactivity disorders; serious emotional disturbance; and authorizes service in grades K-12 and in classes organized primarily for adults through age 22.
<i>Moderate/Severe Disabilities (M/S)</i>	Includes autism; deaf-blindness; moderate to severe mental retardation; multiple disabilities; serious emotional disturbance; and authorizes service in grades K–12 and in classes organized primarily for adults through age 22.
<i>Deaf and Hard of Hearing (DHH)</i>	Includes deafness; hearing impairment; deaf-blindness; and authorizes service to individuals ages birth through 22.
<i>Visual Impairments (VI)</i>	Includes blindness; visual impairment; deaf-blindness; and authorizes service to individuals ages birth through 22.
<i>Physical and Health Impairments (PHI)</i>	Includes orthopedic impairment; other health impairment; multiple disabilities; traumatic brain injury; and authorizes service to individuals ages birth through 22.
<i>Early Childhood Special Education (ECSE)</i>	Includes the mild/moderate and moderate/severe disabilities listed above, and authorizes service to children ages birth to prekindergarten only.

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
