# **BTSA Induction Accreditation Cycle Proposal**

Under the current accountability system, all BTSA Induction programs are engaged in continuous, on-going data collection about program effectiveness, are analyzing the data, and are using the results to make programmatic improvements. Program leaders participate in annual Peer Program Review, Induction Program Review (five year cycle), and complete an Annual Improvement Plan. In an effort to align current practices with the Accreditation system, the following proposed revisions to the existing process are outlined below.

The proposed seven year BTSA Induction Accreditation Cycle is based on a seven-year cycle of activities. The accreditation process is based on an Inquiry model.

## **INQUIRY**

### Rationale

The Inquiry is a structured ongoing process a program uses for program improvement. The documentation gathered throughout the inquiry process leads to the development of the BTSA Induction Biennial Report.

### Description

The inquiry is an action research model used to analyze data for continuous program improvement. It is a collaborative peer process aligned with standards. The BTSA infrastructure monitors and supports the process. Throughout the inquiry process, program leaders:

1. Examine program data
2. Develop an Action Research Plan
3. Implement Action Research Plan
4. Measure outcomes based on data

## **BTSA Induction Biennial Report**

### Rationale

The purpose of the BTSA Induction Biennial Report is to ensure that programs are collecting and analyzing program data on a regular basis and that program improvement activities are being identified based on the results of the analyses (Accreditation Handbook, Chapter 4, page 2).

### Description

The BTSA Induction Biennial Report documents the inquiry cycle that includes the creation and implementation of the action plan, reflection on results of the action plan, and projected program modifications.

**BTSA Induction Program Assessment**

Rationale

The BTSA Induction Program Assessment provides a description of how the program is meeting common and program standards (Accreditation Handbook, Chapter 4 page 2).

Description

The BTSA Induction Program Assessment is a narrative in which the program explains how it is meeting the standards, depicts the participating teacher experiences during the course of their program, describes how the data is used for program improvement, and includes program modifications identified in the BTSA Induction Biennial Report.

In Year 5 of a 7-Year Cycle, programs submit the BTSA Induction Program Assessment to reviewers by March 1<sup>st</sup>. By May 1<sup>st</sup>, reviewers submit questions and comments for

programs to consider during the Site Visit process. No preliminary findings will be made at this point in time.

**Site Visit**

Rationale

The Site Visit confirms the information submitted in the BTSA Induction Program Assessment through access to evidence and interviews with various stakeholders. This visit results in a report to the Committee on Accreditation and recommendation for overall accreditation status.

Description

Through interviews and document review, a review team determines findings, which lead to a final accreditation recommendation made to the Committee on Accreditation.

**Follow – Up**

Rationale

Follow-Up ensures that issues raised during the Accreditation Visit are addressed and that a pathway to full accreditation for programs with findings of Met with Concerns, or Not Met is provided.

Description

Cluster Regional Directors monitor Action Plan implementation and completion, reporting to BTSA Interagency Task Force/Committee on Accreditation as required.
