




California Teachers who were Trained in States Other than California

In 2009-10 about 2,000 initial teaching credentials were issued to teachers prepared in states other than California. Arizona alone constituted more than one-tenth of the out-of-state trained teachers; followed by New York, Texas, and Illinois who constituted another one-fifth of the total initial teaching credentials issued to teachers who were trained in states other than California.

Among the states who trained about 100 teaching credentials each were Pennsylvania, Florida, Michigan, Oregon, Nevada, Massachusetts, Washington, and Ohio. These eight states together constituted about one-third of the total initial credentials issued. These top 12 states accounted for nearly two-thirds (66 percent) of the total initial credentials issued to out-of-state trained teachers in 2009-10.



Note: Data includes Teaching credentials (Multiple, Single subject, and Education Specialists) only. Data includes initial issuance only; does not include renewals.

The following eight states – Colorado, Utah, New Jersey, Virginia, Indiana, Wisconsin, Minnesota, and Maryland prepared less than 50 teaching credentials each, but, together they constituted more than 15 percent of the total initial credentials issued. Other states accounted for the remaining 19 percent of the initial credentials issued to teachers who were trained in states other than California.

It is also interesting to note there were initial credentials issued to teachers from every single state in the USA and Washington D.C.
