




## California Teachers who were Trained in States Other than California

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In 2010-11, about 3,000 initial California teaching credentials were issued to teachers prepared in states other than California, which is about 15 percent of the total initial teaching credentials issued. Arizona alone constituted one-tenth of the out-of-state trained teachers followed by New York with another 10 percent. There were six states – Texas, Illinois, Florida, Michigan, Massachusetts, and Pennsylvania – who had credentialed between 100 to 200 each. These eight states together accounted for half (50 percent) of the total teachers who were trained in other states.

Oregon, Washington, Nevada, Utah, Ohio, Colorado, Georgia, New Jersey accounted for another one-fourth (23 percent) of the total initial teaching credentials issued, each training about 100 teachers. If you add the original eight states, these sixteen states accounted for nearly three-fourths (73 percent) of the total initial teaching credentials issued to out-of-state trained teachers in 2010-11.

Indiana, Virginia, Minnesota, Maryland, Missouri, Wisconsin, North Carolina, Oklahoma, Idaho, Hawaii, Tennessee, New Mexico, Connecticut, Iowa, Louisiana, and Rhode Island – prepared less than 50 each, but, together they constituted more than 19 percent of the total initial teaching credentials issued. The remaining states accounted for the final 8 percent of the initial teaching credentials issued to teachers who were trained in states other than California. All fifty states and Washington D.C were represented in the out-of-state teachers entering the California workforce.
