




Career Technical Education Teaching Credentials Issued

The *Preliminary* Designated Subjects Career Technical Education (CTE) Teaching Credential authorizes the holder to teach within the industry sectors named on the credential in grades twelve and below and in classes organized primarily for adults, in career technical, trade or vocational courses. CTE Teaching Credentials are available in the following 15 *industry sectors*: Agriculture and Natural Resources; Arts, Media, and Entertainment; Building and Construction Trades; Education, Business and Finance; Education, Child Development, and Family Services; Energy, Environment, and Utilities; Engineering and Architecture; Fashion and Interior Design; Health Science and Medical Technology; Hospitality, Tourism, and Recreation; Information and Communication Technologies; Manufacturing and Product Development; Marketing, Sales, and Service; Public Services; and Transportation.

The figure below displays the number of CTE Teaching Credentials issued by industry sectors for 2013-2014.

CTE Teaching Credentials Issued by Industry Sectors: 2013-2014



The highest number of CTE credentials was issued in the industry sector of Arts, Media, and Entertainment (16.9%), followed by Health Science and Medical Technology (14.7%), Building and Construction Trades (11.3%), and Business and Finance (10.5%). Together these four industry sectors accounted for more than half the CTE credentials issued in 2013-2014. The following four industry sectors - Information and Communication Technologies (10.2%), Public Services (8.1%), Education, Child Development, and Family Services (6.6%), Hospitality, Tourism, and Recreation (5.1%) - accounted for about one-third of the credentials issued. The remaining credentials were issued in seven industry sectors: Marketing, Sales and Service (3.9%), Transportation (3.6%), Engineering and Architecture (2.6%), Manufacturing and Product Development (2.5%), Agriculture and Natural Resources (1.9%), Energy, Environment and Utilities (1.2%) and Fashion and Interior Design (0.8%).
