Subject: Requirements for the Level II or Clear Education
Specialist Credential

Summary

The Commission currently issues a two-level special education teaching credential: Level I and Level II credential documents (1997 standards) and Preliminary and Clear (2008-10 Standards) credential documents. This PSA includes a table that lists requirements to earn a Level II or Clear Education Specialist Credential for individuals who are prepared in California and for those who completed their professional preparation programs out-of-state or outside of the United States.

Background

Revised Education Specialist and Other Related Services Credential standards were adopted by the Commission between December 2008 and January 2010. All Education Specialist and Other Related Services Credential programs are required to transition to the revised program standards between January 2010 and September 30, 2011. Due to the transition period, some candidates are now completing the Level I program under the previous set of Education Specialist Credential standards and are deciding whether to complete a Level II program or a Commission-approved induction program to earn a Clear credential. Other candidates are completing the Preliminary program under the currently adopted standards that requires completion of an induction program to earn a Clear credential. As a result, there may be confusion by candidates as to the requirements for clearing their Level I or Preliminary credential.

The attached table identifies the requirements that must be completed to earn a Level II or Clear Education Specialist Credential. Please note that if a Level I candidate chooses to complete the Clear credential program instead of a Level II program the candidate must complete requirements for the Clear credential as well as the content required for the Level II credential. requirement, including CPR, and the technology requirement are specifically addressed in page 3 of the attached table.

Health Education Requirement

The health education requirement for special education is the same health requirement as for the multiple and single subject credential holders and includes the Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) requirement. The course may be taken either at a two- or four-year college or university. Also see note below in box.

Technology Requirement

Foundational technology may be met by a course taken at a four-year college or university or achieving a passing score on the Preliminary Education Technology examination.

The advanced technology requirement may be met by a course taken at a four-year college or university that has a Commission-approved preliminary multiple/single subject program. An individual may complete the multiple/single subject technology course that meets Standard 11. Many four-year colleges and universities offer one technology course that covers both basic and advanced technology content. Also see note below in box.

A Commission-approved induction or Level II program may make an equivalency for the health (not including CPR portion) requirement and the basic and/or advanced technology requirement with documentation of the reason for the equivalency in the individual's file.
