1. Public Hearing

In accordance with Commission Policy and Administrative Procedures, proposed Title 5 Regulations amending Section 80487 (Fees) have been scheduled for Public Hearing. The proposed Title 5 Regulations, Section 80487, are written to implement the Fee Component of AB 757 (Basic Skills Assessment Examination) and SB 631 (Fee Increase). The schedule for the Public Hearing follows:

80487. Fees.

(a) The Commission sets the following fees for issuance, renewal, duplicates or replacements of teaching and related credentials:

(1) Thirty Forty dollars for the issuance or renewal of a teaching or related credential.

(2) Fifteen Twenty dollars for a duplicate or replacement credential.

(3) Two-hundred fifty dollars for a Board of Examiners' fee as provided in Section 80076.

(4) Thirty Forty dollars for an examination processing fee as provided in Section 80077.

(5) Thirty dollars for the state basic skills assessment examination pursuant to Education Code 44252.5.

(b) The fee shall accompany the application for issuance or renewal, or the request for a duplicate or replacement credential; the fee shall be deemed earned upon receipt and ~~shall not be refunded even though the applicant does not~~ qualify for the credential or subsequently finds a reportedly lost or destroyed document.

(c) The applicant shall receive either a credential or an evaluation which sets forth the requirements which have not been met.

(d) Where an applicant has all the qualifications for a credential at the time the application therefor is submitted, but where required verification or documentation has been delayed, no new or additional fee shall be charged if such required verification or documentation is submitted within one year.

(e) Where applicable, each application for a credential shall be accompanied by an examination processing fee pursuant to Section 80077 of these regulations.

2. Emergency Regulations: Increase of Application Fee.

The Commission adopted, at its October 1981 meeting, an amendment to Section 80487(a)(1), on an emergency basis, effective December 1, 1981. The change that will become effective December 1, 1981 reads as follows:

80487. Fees.

(a) The Commission sets the following fees for issuance, renewal, duplicates or replacements of teaching and related credentials.

(1) ~~Thirty~~ Forty dollars for the issuance or renewal of a teaching or related credential.

3. Emergency Regulations: Establishing the Fee for the Basic Skills Assessment Examination.

The Commission adopted, at its October 1981 meeting, a new subsection to Title 5 Regulation 80487, on an emergency basis, effective January 1, 1982. This new subsection, implementing the fee component of AB 757 on the same date the bill becomes law, will enable the Commission to administer the Basic Skills Assessment Examination as soon as possible, following the January 1, 1982, date. The new subsection of 80487 that will become effective January 1, 1982, reads as follows:

80487. Fees.

(a) The Commission sets the following fees for issuance, renewal, duplicates or replacements of teaching and related credentials.

(5) Thirty dollars for the state basic skills assessment examination pursuant to Education Code Section 44252.5.

NOTE: It is anticipated that coded correspondence on implementation of AB 757 (Basic Skills Assessment Examination) will be mailed to you early January, 1982.

4. Fee Schedule:

Based on a December 1, 1981 date for implementation of Title 5 Regulations Section 80487(a)(1), on an emergency basis; a January 1, 1982 date for the implementation of Title 5 Regulations Section 80487(a)(5), on an emergency basis; and a March 1, 1982 date for full implementation of the proposed Title 5 Regulations, the following fee schedule will prevail:
