SUBJECT: Proposed Adopted Regulation Section 80071.4,
Basic Skills Examination

In accordance with Commission policy and administrative regulations in the California Government Code, the above-cited Title 5 regulation is distributed prior to public hearing. The public hearing to adopt this regulation is scheduled as follows:

December 2, 1982
1:30 p.m.
Mansion Inn
16th and H Streets
Sacramento, California

This regulation tells who must take the new basic skills test as one requirement for the award of a credential. It also sets the conditions that must be met by a school district or county education office if the Commission is to arrange for a special administration in the event that an emergency hiring problem arises.

Please feel free to duplicate and distribute the attached regulation as proposed for amendment to anyone you believe might be interested in responding. If you wish to make a presentation regarding the above to the Commission, please bring thirty copies of your material for distribution to the Commissioners and staff. If you provide this statement to the Commission office by November 24, 1982, sufficient copies of the material will be duplicated and distributed for Commission and staff use. We would also appreciate a call to the Commission office if you plan to make a presentation in order to schedule sufficient time on the agenda for people who wish to address the Commission. If you do not want to make a presentation or submit a statement regarding this proposed regulation, you can reply on the response form found on the last page.

The proposed regulation is as follows:

80071.4 Basic Skills Examination

(a) After January 31, 1983, every applicant for an initial credential, permit, or certificate or for the renewal of an emergency credential shall be required to have obtained a passing score on the California Basic Educational Skills Test (CBEST). This requirement applies for any given credential, permit, certificate or additional authorization that has not been awarded previously.

(b) Pursuant to Education Code Section 44252(b)(1)(2), applicants for the following credentials are exempt from this requirement:

(1) a credential to be issued solely for teaching adults in an apprenticeship program; and

(2) a credential for an adult education designated subject other than an academic subject.

(c) Pursuant to Education Code Section 44252(b)(3), applicants who are credentialed or can meet the requirements for a credential in another state and apply to the Commission after January 31, 1983 and before July 1, 1984 will be issued a one year non-renewable emergency credential until they have passed the CBEST. This credential will, however, be issued only upon receipt of written verification from a district that the individual is an applicant for employment and has passed the Basic Skills Proficiency Test developed by the district.

(d) Pursuant to Education Code Section 44253, applicants for a vocational designated subjects credential will be given a one year preliminary or internship credential until they have passed the CBEST.

(e) An applicant for any credential, permit, certificate, or supplementary authorization shall be required to have passed the CBEST only once, regardless of the time that has elapsed between the date of passing the test and the date of the application.

(f) The Commission will administer this test at least three times in a calendar year, and at appropriate times during the year so that school district and/or county superintendents will be able to identify a list of people qualified to meet their ordinary needs for substitute teachers.

(g) The Commission will arrange for a special administration of the test within ten working days of receipt of written verification by the local education agency governing board that the conditions specified below have been met. Arrangements for special administrations will not be made until this written verification has been received.

(g) continued

(1) Substitutes must be found for at least 25 percent or forty of the teaching staff, whichever is the larger number, at one time.

(2) The district or county agrees to provide space suitable for the test administration, and to provide administrative support in identifying qualified examination proctors and in accomplishing the test registration process.

(3) The district or county agrees to reimburse the Commission for all necessary costs of a special administration that are in excess of those recovered by the applicant test fee that is specified by law. Such costs include, but are not necessarily limited to, expenses for the time and travel of a qualified test supervisor that exceed those paid for a regular administration, costs of assembling qualified people to grade the Writing section of the test if the number of papers to be read does not permit the most efficient use of the graders' time, administrative coordination by the contractor, and special data processing costs.

(4) The district or county agrees not to require the credential applicant to pay any of these excess costs.

(h) The Commission will gather and make available annually data on the proportions of examinees who passed the test, grouped on the basis of the California institution of higher education attended.

(i) An applicant who fails the test may repeat it as many times as he/she wishes; the test fee for each attempt will be that specified in Section 80487(a)(5) of these regulations.
