

Statement of Reasons

Education Code Section 44254 provides that emergency credentials may be issued in accordance with regulations adopted by the Commission. Title 5 Section 80024.6 would establish an emergency credential for the Library Media teacher.

Sections 80023 through 80027 of Title 5 Regulations provide that a number of emergency credentials be established in accordance with Commission regulations. Section 80024.6 as amended would establish an emergency credential for the Library Media Teacher.

Any interested person, or his or her authorized representative, may submit written comments on the proposed actions. The written comment period closes at 5:00 p.m. on January 31, 1990.

Any written comments received 14 days prior to the public hearing will be reproduced by the Commission's staff for each Commissioner as a courtesy to the person submitting the comments and will be included in the written agenda prepared for and presented to the full Commission at the hearing.

Public Hearing

Oral comments on the proposed action will be taken at the public hearing. We would appreciate 14 days advance notice in order to schedule sufficient time on the agenda. You may call Dr. Fitch at (916)445-0184.

Any person wishing to submit written comments at the public hearing may do so. It is requested, but not required, that persons submitting such comments provide twenty-five copies. All written statements submitted at the hearing will, however, be given full consideration regardless of the number of copies submitted.

Modification of Proposed Actions

If the Commission proposes to modify the action(s) hereby proposed, the modifications (other than nonsubstantial or solely grammatical modifications) will be made available for public comment for at least 15 days before they are adopted.

PART VIII OF TITLE 5 - CALIFORNIA CODE OF REGULATIONS

PROPOSED ADDITION OF SECTION 80024.6
EMERGENCY LIBRARY MEDIA TEACHER PERMIT

80024.6. Emergency Library Media Teacher Permit.

(a) Requirements for the initial issuance of the Emergency Library Media Teacher Permit for persons holding a valid California Teaching Credential:

(1) The applicant must possess a valid California Teaching Credential based on a baccalaureate degree and completion of an approved preparation program, including student teaching, or its equivalent:

(2) The applicant who holds a valid California Teaching Credential as defined in (1) must provide evidence that he or she is enrolled in one or more courses leading towards the completion of a Library Media Teacher Credential.

(3) The applicant must submit the Statement of Need described in Section 80026.

(b) Requirements for the initial issuance of the Emergency Library Media Teacher Permit for persons holding a valid service credential from a state other than California.

(1) The applicant must hold a valid out-of-state credential or certificate authorizing service as a school librarian and:

(A) A valid teaching credential based on a baccalaureate degree and completion of a teacher preparation program, including student teaching, or its equivalent.

(2) The out-of-state applicant must provide evidence that he or she is enrolled in one or more courses leading towards a clear California Teaching Credential and/or a California Library Media Teacher Credential.

(c) Requirements for renewal of the Emergency Library Media Teacher Permit.

(1) The applicant must provide evidence that he or she has successfully completed six semester units of college work leading to the Library Media Teacher Credential and/or the California Teaching Credential within the previous year.

(2) The applicant must submit the Statement of Need described in Section 80026.

(d) Authorization. The Emergency Library Media Teacher Permit authorizes the same service as the clear Library Media Teacher Credential.
