For the Commission to accept the evaluations by the Educational Records Evaluation Service or the World Education Services, Inc., candidates must submit original, official documentation to these agencies. To indicate that the evaluation is based on this original, official documentation, Educational Records Evaluation Service provides a statement within the body of the letter and World Education Services, Inc. lists "California" as the purpose for the evaluation. Those applying for an evaluation by the Institute for International Credentials Evaluation at CSU Fresno or the International Education Research Foundation, Inc. must follow the procedure outlined in the agency's brochure.

These agencies have Commission approval to determine equivalencies of coursework and degrees completed at colleges and universities in countries other than the United States, Canada, and Spain. They are private agencies and do charge service fees for which the credential candidate is responsible. The agency's original evaluation letter and a photocopy of the original documentation must accompany the credential application packet when it is submitted to the Commission. The Commission has the ultimate authority to accept equivalency of coursework. The Commission staff will continue to evaluate coursework and degrees from Canada and Spain.
