Chair Cheung convened the June 4, 2009 General Session of the Commission on Teacher Credentialing. Roll call was taken and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

3A: Approval of the April 2009 Minutes

Commissioner Gaston moved approval of the April 2009 Minutes with the correction to add Commissioner Shane Martin's name to the list of Commissioners in attendance at the meeting. Commissioner McInerney seconded the motion. The motion passed without dissent.

3B: Approval of the June 2009 Agenda

Commissioner Blackburn moved approval of the Commission's June 2009 Agenda with a revised agenda item for 5A and an agenda insert for item 4B. Commissioner Dean seconded the motion. The motion passed without dissent.

3C: Approval of the June 2009 Consent Calendar

Commissioner Sun moved approval of the Consent Calendar. Commissioner McInerney seconded the motion. The motion passed without dissent.

3D: Address the Commission

Chair Cheung introduced Dr. Glen Thomas, California's Secretary of Education, to the Commission and invited him to the table to speak on his vision of California education.

Secretary Thomas gave a speech on his view of reexamining public education during this budget crisis and about the Governor's priorities for California education.

3E: Chair's Report

Chair Cheung announced the resignation of Marilyn McGrath, Ex-Officio member representing the California Postsecondary Education Commission and recognized her contributions to the work of the Commission.

Chair Cheung also introduced Rae Belisle, the new liaison from the State Board of Education to the Commission.

3F: Executive Director's Report

Executive Director Dale Janssen welcomed Ms. Paula Jacobs as a new Consultant in the Professional Services Division.

Director Janssen also announced that Mike McKibbin, an administrator from the Professional Services Division, would retire from the Commission at the end of June.

3G: Commission Member Reports

There were no reports.

3H: Liaison Reports

Commissioner Sun reported that she attended the California Standards for the Teaching Profession (CSTP) Advisory Panel meeting in April and the Committee on Accreditation (COA) meeting in May.

Legislative Committee

Committee Chair Margaret Gaston convened the Legislative Committee.

4A: Status of Legislation

Marilyn Errett, Administrator, Office of Governmental Relations, presented this item which provided an update on the status of bills on which the Commission has taken a position and on the Commission's sponsored bills.

4B: Analyses of Bills

Committee Chair Margaret Gaston informed the Commission that, although there was an analysis of SB 199 (Ducheny) in the agenda, there would be no discussion because the bill was held on the suspense file in the Senate Appropriations Committee.

Marilyn Errett, Administrator, Office of Governmental Relations, presented an analysis of AB 544 (Coto).

Richard Applegate, representing himself, submitted a written letter in support of this bill.

Leanne Hilton, UC Berkeley Department of Linguistics, submitted a written letter urging the Commission to support this bill.

Nakia Zavalla, Santa Ynez Band of Chumash Indians, urged the Commission to support AB 544.

Commissioner Pearson moved to take a position of “Support” on AB 544. Commissioner Blackburn seconded the motion. The motion carried without dissent.

Erin Duff, Assistant Consultant, Office of Governmental Relations, presented an analysis of SB 19 (Simitian).

Commissioner McInerney moved to take a position of “Support” on SB 19. Commissioner Sun seconded the motion. The motion carried without dissent.

Mary Armstrong, Director, Office of Governmental Relations, presented an analysis of AB 1025 (Conway).

Commissioner Sun moved to take a position of “Support if Amended” on AB 1025. Commissioner Gahagan seconded the motion. The motion carried without dissent.

Credentialing and Certificated Assignments Committee

Committee Chair Irene Oropeza-Enriquez convened the Credentialing and Certificated Assignments Committee.

5A: Request for Consideration of Eminence Credential

Edye Ipsaro, Associate Analyst, Certification, Assignment and Waivers Division, presented this item which provided a summary of materials submitted by the Governing Board of Palisades Charter High School, a Charter School in Los Angeles County, on behalf of Mr. Richard Steil for an Eminence Credential.

Mr. Richard Steil, Eminence Credential Applicant, gave a brief presentation about his background and teaching experience in the subject of Photography.

Commissioner Pearson moved approval of Mr. Richard Steil’s Eminence Credential in the subject of Photography. Commissioner Gaston seconded the motion. The motion carried without dissent.

5B: Proposed Amendments and Additions to 5 California Code of Regulations Pertaining to Special Education Teaching and Services Credentials

Terri Fesperman, Consultant, Certification, Assignment and Waivers Division, presented this item which provided proposed amendments, additions and deletions pertaining to Special Education Teaching and Services Credentials.

Robert Powell, CA Speech-Language-Hearing Association, raised his concerns regarding the title and definition of the Communication Development Credential.

Rande Webster, California Association of Professors of Special Education, raised her concerns regarding the requirements of earning a clear special education credential and funding for the program.

Sharon Robison, Association of California School Administrators, submitted a written letter and spoke in support of this item.

Merrilee Johnson, Personnel Administrative Services Steering Committee, spoke in support of Communication Development Credential.

Commissioner Blackburn moved to approve the amendments, additions and deletions to 5 California Code of Regulations concerning Special Education Teaching and Services Credentials for the purpose of beginning the rulemaking file for submission to the Office of Administrative Law and scheduling a public hearing. Commissioner McInerney seconded the motion. The motion carried without dissent.

5C: Proposed Additions and Amendments to 5 California Code of Regulations Pertaining to Designated Subjects Career Technical Education Teaching Credentials

Tammy Duggan, Program Specialist, Certification, Assignment and Waivers Division, presented proposed additions and amendments to 5 California Code of Regulations pertaining to Designated Subjects Career Technical Education Teaching Credentials due to the passage of recent legislation.

Commissioner Gaston moved to approve the amendments and additions to 5 California Code of Regulations pertaining to the Designated Subjects Career Technical Education Teaching Credentials for the purpose of beginning the rulemaking file for submission to the Office of Administrative Law and scheduling a public hearing. Commissioner Sun seconded the motion. The motion carried without dissent.

Professional Services Committee

Committee Chair Ting Sun convened the Professional Services Committee.

6A: Adoption of the Multiple and Single Subject Clear Credential Program Standards

Terry Janicki, Consultant, and Teri Clark, Administrator, Professional Services Division, presented the proposed revisions to the Multiple and Single Subject Clear Credential program standards for Commission adoption.

Commissioner McInerney moved to approve the proposed Multiple and Single Subject Clear Credential program standards as presented in Appendix A. Commissioner Dean seconded the motion. The motion carried without dissent.

6B: Initial Institutional Approval

Teri Clark, Administrator, Professional Services Division, presented this item which provided one prospective program sponsor for initial institutional approval by the Commission.

Commissioner Pearson moved to approve the application for initial institutional approval submitted by Brandman University. Commissioner Blackburn seconded the motion. The motion carried without dissent.

6C: Update on the Implementation of the Teaching Performance Assessment (TPA) Requirement

Phyllis Jacobson, Administrator, Professional Services Division, presented this item which provided an update on the activities that have taken place to implement the Teaching Performance Assessment requirement since July 1, 2008.

Kendyll Stansbury, Performance Assessment for California Teachers (PACT), assisted staff in answering questions regarding this item.

Theresa Montano, California Teachers Association, raised her concerns regarding the requirements of the TPA.

6D: Update on the Implementation of Special Education Credential Reforms

Jan Jones-Wadsworth, Consultant, and Michael McKibbin, Administrator, Professional Services Division presented this item which provided an update on the development of Education Specialist Teaching and Other Related Services Credentials including information on proposed Teaching Performance Expectations for Education Specialist Teaching Credentials, proposed Preconditions, and a proposed implementation schedule.

6F: Update on the Review of the *California Standards for the Teaching Profession* (CSTP)

Terry Janicki and Karen Sacramento, Consultants, Professional Services Division, presented this item which provided an update on the review of the CSTP, including a draft of potential revisions to the CSTP.

Andrea Whittaker, San Jose State University, Paula Lovo, Ventura County Office of Education, Wendy Baron, Santa Cruz County Office of Education/ New Teacher Center at UC Santa Cruz and, Ellen Ringer, California Department of Education, assisted staff in presenting this item.

Susan Westbrook, California Federation of Teachers (CFT), requested the Commission delay the date for final consideration and adoption to allow CFT the opportunity to provide additional input on the draft standards.

Kathy Harris, California Teachers Association, thanked the panel and staff for their work on the standards and requested that the final draft of the standards not be presented to the Commission until the November 2009 meeting.

The Commission directed the CSTP panel members to continue their discussions and finalize the language regarding Standard 3. The Commission also directed staff to work with CFT and CTA to get their feedback on the standards before the final revisions are presented for Commission consideration and possible adoption at the August 2009 meeting.

6G: Update on the Work with the Preliminary Administrative Services Credential Program Standards

Jo Birdsell, Consultant, and Teri Clark, Administrator, Professional Services Division, presented this item which provided an update on work to modify the Administrative Services Credential Program Standards by removing required elements previously contained within the standards as directed by the Commission in August 2008.

6H: Update on Alternative Subject Matter Competency Assessment for Additional Less Commonly Taught Languages Other Than English (LOTE)

Phyllis Jacobson, Administrator, Professional Services Division, presented this item which provided an update on the implementation of the plan for an alternative subject matter competency assessment process to meet the needs of teachers of those less commonly taught languages other than English.

6E: Pedagogical Preparation to Teach Mathematics

Teri Clark, Administrator, Professional Services Division, presented this item which provided a description of the pedagogical preparation that individuals must complete to earn a teaching credential that authorizes an individual to teach mathematics in California's K-12 public schools.
