Program Approval

Introduction

This agenda item presents five subject matter programs submitted by institutions of higher education for approval. It is possible that the San Jose State University ESM program review will be completed before the Commission meeting. If the reviewers have recommended approval prior to the Commission meeting, an agenda insert will be added for Commission consideration as part of this agenda item.

Background

The Commission regularly receives recommendations for program approval from subject matter review panels. These panels of subject matter experts review all program documentation and make an informed determination whether the program meets the standards common to all subject matter programs and also the content specific subject matter standards. The content specific subject matter standards are closely aligned to the K-12 academic content standards. These subject matter programs are usually undergraduate courses of study completed before candidates begin teacher preparation programs. However, the two programs may be completed concurrently.

Subject Matter Program Review Procedures

Following are the general procedures for the review of subject matter programs:

1. Technical Assistance – After the Commission adopts a set of new program standards, Commission staff members provide technical assistance to prospective program sponsors wishing to submit responses to the new standards. Technical assistance materials are provided on the Commission’s website. Staff members train, assign, and coordinate review team work.
2. Preconditions Review – After the program proposal is received, subject matter educators review the sponsor’s response to the preconditions. The preconditions are based on both state laws and Commission policies, and address minimum unit and content area requirements. If the preconditions response is incomplete, the sponsor is requested to provide specific information necessary for compliance with the preconditions.
3. Program Review – The program sponsor’s responses to the Commission’s subject matter program standards are reviewed by a team of two or more subject matter educators to determine if the program meets the program standards, including the subject matter requirements (SMRs). The SMRs are the content knowledge required to be covered in the program and are aligned to the K-12 content standards that the candidate will be expected to know. The reviewers are trained

in the alignment of the standards and subject matter requirements and in the review process before they are assigned proposals to review. Reviewers are instructed to find explicit evidence that programs not only align with K-12 content standards but also introduce their candidates to those standards within the context of their subject matter studies. The team must reach consensus that each standard is met based upon evidence provided in the document. If the program does not meet the standards, the sponsor is given an explanation of the findings. The sponsor may then submit the additional information requested. Once reviewers determine that the program proposal provides a convincing and adequate body of evidence to meet the Commission's adopted subject matter program standards, the program is recommended to the Commission for approval.

4. After subject matter program approval is granted by the Commission, the institution may admit candidates to the approved subject matter program. Graduates of a Commission approved subject matter preparation program meet the Commission's subject matter requirement and are not required to take the subject matter examination (California Subject Examinations for Teachers).

This report presents five subject matter programs that have been deemed to have met all of the appropriate *Standards of Quality and Effectiveness for Subject Matter Preparation Programs* (www.ctc.ca.gov/educator-prep/STDS-subject-matter.html) by an appropriate review panel and are recommended to the Commission for approval. The programs brought forward to the Commission for approval at this time are: California State University, Channel Islands Elementary Subject Matter; California State University, Dominguez Hills Elementary Subject Matter; California State University, Long Beach Elementary Subject Matter; California State University, Stanislaus Elementary Subject Matter; and Concordia University Irvine Elementary Subject Matter.

Summary Information on the Proposed Elementary Subject Matter Program

Effective April 1, 2017, successful completion of a Commission approved Elementary Subject Matter (ESM) program will waive the CSET Multiple Subjects exam for candidates and serve as demonstration of subject matter competency for the purpose of earning a credential. The preconditions for the ESM program require that there be a minimum of 84 semester units, or equivalent quarter units, including, but not limited to, language studies and literature; mathematics; science; social science, history, and humanities; visual and performing arts; physical education; and human development. In addition, there must be a concentration of a minimum of 12 semester units in one of the identified content areas.

It is important to note that ESM programs are embedded within a variety of majors. The Commission's authority extends only to those parts of the academic study that address the ESM requirements. Any remaining number of units required for a given major, the course requirements for those units, and the specific name of the major are institutional level decisions.

California State University, Channel Islands Elementary Subject Matter

The California State University, Channel Islands (CI) Elementary Subject Matter Program (ESM) will be a required set of courses for Liberal Studies majors. The ESM responds to teachers who need to draw from many areas of subject matter knowledge. CI is committed to providing an ESM program that addresses the needs of diverse learners for academic competence in a technologically-situated society. The ESM learning outcomes include demonstrating subject matter competency in each of the subject matter domains: Reading, Language, and Literature; History and Social Studies; Mathematics; Science; Visual and Performing Arts; Physical Education; and Human Development as evidenced in the Alignment Matrix.

The California State University, Channel Islands ESM program consists of 85 semester units of coursework including a 12-unit concentration. Candidates complete the ESM program over six semesters. It is the required foundational coursework for all three teacher preparation pathways offered at CI. One pathway results in the B.A Liberal Studies degree without teaching credential coursework and requires candidates to enroll in a post-baccalaureate credential program. The second and third pathways allow candidates to complete an integrated undergraduate and credential program with a total of 135 units and upon completion they would receive a B.A. Liberal Studies degree and either a Multiple Subject or Educational Specialist credential.

California State University, Dominguez Hills Elementary Subject Matter

The Department of Liberal Studies, part of the College of Education (COE) at California State University, Dominguez Hills (CSUDH), has the commitment of the COE Dean and College Leadership to provide the necessary resources, including fiscal, human, and physical, to maintain a quality, rigorous Elementary Subject Matter program. The Elementary Subject Matter program at CSUDH, embedded within the B.A. in Liberal Studies, builds on the TK-8 state-adopted content standards, including courses in English, history, math, science, visual and performing arts, physical education, and human development. In addition, a number of courses are intentionally interdisciplinary and provide Liberal Studies students with needed development in academic literacy and technology, along with foundational concepts and pedagogy in education, with an emphasis on social justice. The ESM program consists of 87 units; additionally, all Liberal Studies students complete an option (concentration/depth of study) of 12-14 units.

Scheduling, assessment and advisement for the ESM will leverage the well-developed systems within the Liberal Studies Department, while coordination with other departments to ensure consistency and rigor in the coursework addressing the SMRs will be the responsibility of the ESM Coordinator and the Department Chair. The Liberal Studies advising system will be expanded to include the ESM requirements with the ESM Coordinator and Department Chair having the final responsibility to sign-off on completion of the ESM.

California State University, Long Beach Elementary Subject Matter

The Elementary Subject Matter (ESM) program at California State University (CSU), Long Beach is embedded in the Liberal Studies bachelor's degree. Any student who completes this degree also completes the ESM program and earns a waiver from taking the CSET.

The Liberal Studies Department at CSU Long Beach serves students who are seeking subject matter preparation for careers in elementary education. Liberal Studies offers both a B.A. degree and the Integrated Teacher Education Program (ITEP) degree. Students who complete the core coursework for the B.A. (on its own or as part of the ITEP program) will complete all elements of an Elementary Subject Matter program that will prepare them for their Multiple Subject Credential. The Liberal Studies degree with the ESM program is 120 units for the B.A., and 135 units for the ITEP. Both B.A. and ITEP students will complete 12 units of concentration coursework in one of six areas: Language Arts, Mathematics, Natural Science, History-Social science, Human and Child Development, and Educational studies.

Both the B.A. and ITEP programs are designed to include the required 84 units of subject matter preparation, and to fully meet the CTC's subject matter requirements (SMRs). Every course in the subject matter core is standards-based. Extensive collaboration with faculty in Arts and Sciences has resulted in coursework that not only meets the SMRs but represents strong pre-service subject matter preparation.

California State University, Stanislaus Elementary Subject Matter

The Elementary Subject Matter (ESM) preparation program is part of the Liberal Studies major at California State University, (CSU) Stanislaus and is designed to meet the subject matter requirements of the Multiple Subject credential. The ESM program prepares candidates to teach all subjects in the domains of Reading, Language, and Literature, History and Social Science, Math, Science, the Visual and Performing Arts, Physical Education, and Human Development. Students in the program are able to meet the majority of their subject matter requirements with aligned lower and upper division General Education (GE) courses and/or through an Associate in Art for Transfer (AA-T) from a community college. Remaining subject matter requirements not met through GE are met in major coursework. Students are required to complete a concentration, in accordance with the ESM preconditions.

Liberal Studies majors meet with a faculty advisor regularly to ensure they take the appropriate subject matter courses. The Liberal Studies Department Chair and ESM Program Coordinator will continue to collaborate with faculty and administration across the subject matter disciplines to ensure that coursework addresses the Commission's adopted subject matter requirements (SMRs). Liberal Studies faculty regularly engage in assessment and evaluation of a variety of data, including a student survey, review of signature assignments (from a capstone and other Liberal Studies courses) and other indicators to maintain continuous improvement of the subject matter program. The capstone course provides students with an opportunity to review and reinforce their subject matter knowledge, as well as reflect on and demonstrate basic skills and competencies necessary for them to become effective and successful teachers through writing and oral presentation assignments.

Concordia University Irvine Elementary Subject Matter

Concordia University Irvine's Elementary Subject Matter program will provide Liberal Studies majors the opportunity to demonstrate mastery of ESM program requirements while they move through their undergraduate major.

Concordia's ESM program is administered through a rich, collaborative partnership with the School of Arts and Science (SOAS) and the School of Education (SOE). The SOAS and SOE collaborate on all pertinent liberal studies syllabi to ensure that each ESM program standard is covered in-depth and assessed to assure student mastery. Candidates are carefully advised on how to navigate through the required Liberal Studies curriculum by university staff advisors and the Director of Elementary Teacher Education Program. In addition, candidates receive information and guidance on all Liberal Studies and Teacher Education requirements in their *Introduction to Teaching Careers* course. The program consists of 85 units and candidates choose a concentration study in one of the seven content areas.

Concordia's ESM program will greatly enhance the relevancy of students' undergraduate experience as they gain competence and confidence in their ability to deliver substantive 21st-century content in their future classrooms.
