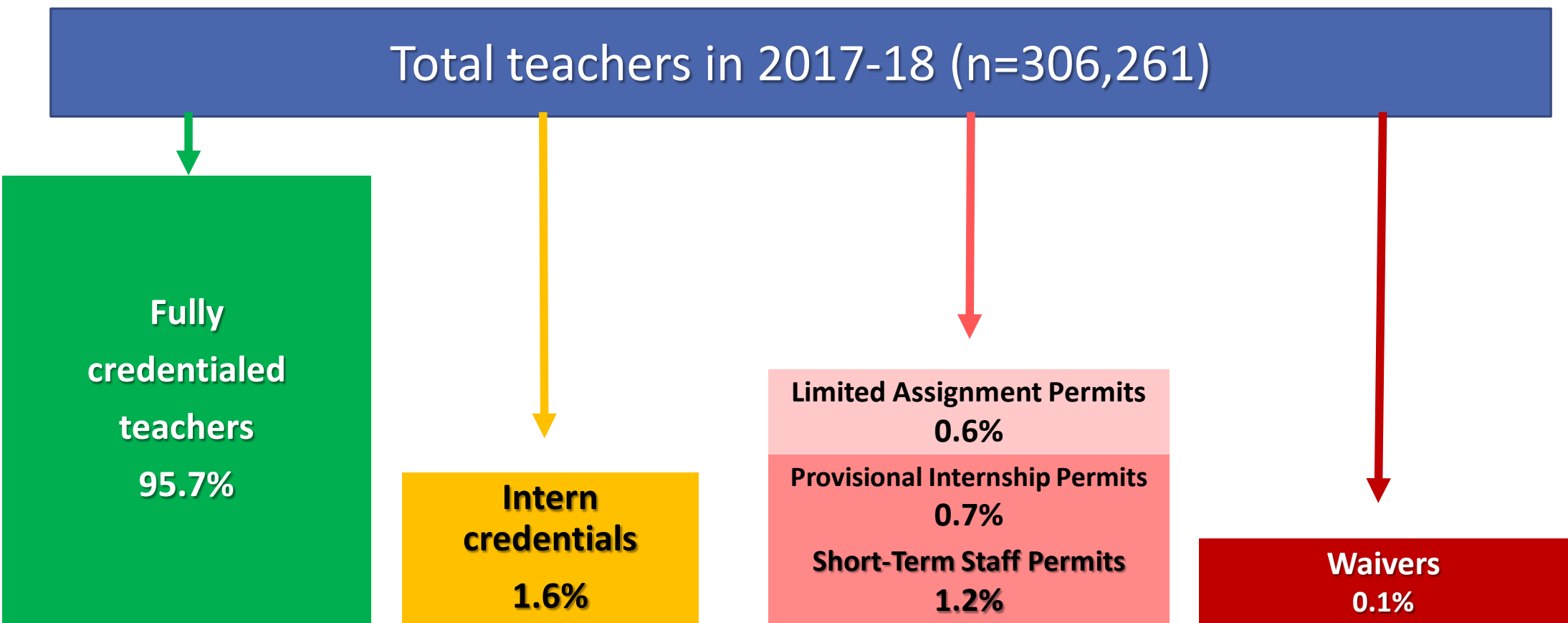
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Required Reporting by Education Code §44225.6

- 1) Number and type of Multiple Subject, Single Subject and Education Specialist credentials recommended by Institutions of Higher Education and alternative certification pathways
- 2) Number of individuals recommended by school districts operating district internship programs and the type of credentials
- 3) Number of initial credentials based on completion outside of California by type and authorization
- 4) Number of emergency permit, credential waiver or other authorizations
- 5) Number of Certificate of Completion of Staff Development issued pursuant to Education Code §44253.10
- 6) Number of intern credentials, permits and waivers by county and district, and the percentage of total teachers statewide

95.7% of employed teachers hold a preliminary or clear credential
4.3% of employed teachers hold an intern credential, permit or waiver



Summary of selected findings from 2017-18 report

- There was a total of 16,518 new teaching credentials issued in 2017-18
- Fourth year of increase in newly issued teaching credentials (Multiple Subject, Single Subject and Education Specialist)
- **Increase/decrease** of preliminary teaching credentials by preparation pathways:
 - CA IHE-prepared +3.6%
 - CA District-prepared -28.4%
 - Out-of-State/Out-of-Country -6.1%

Summary of selected findings from 2017-18 report *(continued)*

- CA IHE-prepared 73.7% of the total new credentials issued
- Increase in the number of new teacher candidates enrolled in the teacher preparation programs (+11.5 percent)
- Increase in the number of teacher candidates enrolled in the university and district intern programs (+13 percent)
- Increase in the number of permits (Short-term Staff, Provisional internship, Limited Assignment) (+3.1 percent)
- Decrease in the number of waivers (-4.2 percent)

Recommended Action

Teacher Supply Report is an action item.

Staff recommend that the Commission approve the Teacher Supply in California, 2017-18 for transmittal to the Governor and the Legislature by April 15
