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# Request to Continue Issuance of CBEST Deferrals for Candidates that Continue to be Impacted by COVID-19 Testing Center Closures

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## Introduction

This agenda item requests that the Commission on Teacher Credentialing (Commission) authorize staff to continue the practice of granting deferrals for the California Basic Education Skills Test (CBEST) for applicants impacted by testing center closures through August 31, 2021. Such deferrals would be available for qualified candidates who are unable to take the CBEST exam due to continued testing center closures caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.

## Background

At the April 2020 meeting, the Commission approved multiple flexibilities to relieve COVID-19 related barriers effecting credential candidates that were presented in [Item 3A](#). Among the multiple flexibilities approved were flexibilities related to the CBEST and the Basic Skills Requirement for Commission-issued documents. Specifically, the Commission voted to allow candidates to request a deferral of the CBEST if a candidate was unable to complete the examination due to the health and safety restrictions related to COVID-19 between March 19, 2020 and September 1, 2020. At the [October 2020 meeting](#), the Commission approved by consent a continuance of the deferral through January 1, 2021.

## Need for Commission Action to Continue Issuance of CBEST Deferrals

Staff was hopeful that testing centers offering the CBEST examination would be able to open the majority of testing locations, or implement at-home testing options, by the end of 2020. However, it is apparent that this may not occur and that credential candidates may continue to be impacted by a lack of testing options to meet the Basic Skills Requirement. It is anticipated that conditions will remain difficult for credential candidates through August 31, 2021.

## Staff Recommendation

Staff recommends that the Commission move to allow staff to continue to issue CBEST deferrals to impacted candidates as needed through August 31, 2021. All criterion associated with the CBEST deferral will remain the same as outlined in the April 2020 agenda item.

## Next Steps

If approved, staff will continue to accept, and grant CBEST deferral requests submitted for qualifying candidates through August 31, 2021.

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# Program Approval

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## **Introduction**

This agenda item presents one Single Subject Matter program submitted by an institution of higher education for approval.

## **Background**

The Commission regularly receives recommendations for program approval from subject matter review panels. The content specific subject matter standards are closely aligned to the K-12 academic content standards. These subject matter programs are usually undergraduate courses of study completed before candidates begin teacher preparation programs. However, the two programs may be completed concurrently.

## **Subject Matter Program Review Procedures**

Subject matter educators review the submitting institution's response to the preconditions. The preconditions are based on both state laws and Commission policies and address the minimum unit and content area requirements. The institution's responses to the Commission's subject matter program standards are reviewed by a team of two or more subject matter educators to determine if the program meets the program standards, including the Subject Matter Requirements (SMRs). The SMRs are the content knowledge required to be covered in the program and are aligned to the K-12 content standards that the candidate will be expected to know. If the program does not meet the standards, the institution is given an explanation of the findings. The institution may then submit the additional information requested. Once reviewers determine that the program proposal provides a convincing and adequate body of evidence to meet the Commission's adopted subject matter program standards, the program is recommended to the Commission for approval. After subject matter program approval is granted by the Commission, the institution may admit candidates to the approved subject matter program. Graduates of a Commission-approved subject matter preparation program meet the Commission's SMRs and are not required to take the subject matter examination (California Subject Examinations for Teachers).

## **Summary of Information on the Proposed Subject Matter Program**

### **San Jose State University**

The World Languages and Literatures Department at San Jose State University created a subject matter proposal that prepares students to enter the Single Subject credential program by taking 40 semester units of advanced coursework in Spanish to receive their Bachelor of Arts in Spanish. The program will provide a wide range of coursework in Spanish language, linguistics, literature, and culture. All courses will be taught in Spanish and students will complete assignments, presentations, and exams using the Spanish language. Prospective teachers in the Spanish major will take courses that are designed and periodically reviewed to ensure their compatibility and adequacy to the World Language Content Standards for California Public

Schools, K-12, and the California World Languages Framework. All courses will be academically rigorous and intellectually stimulating but will be clearly conducive to students' achievement of full subject matter competency in accordance with the demands of the State. The Spanish department strives to form professional educators who not only learn about the linguistic, literary, and pragmatic aspects of the subject matter, but also develop the intellectual curiosity and critical thinking skills needed for teaching Spanish in the 21st century.

**Staff Recommendation**

Staff recommends that the Commission approve the subject matter program shown below:
