Program Approval

Introduction

This agenda item presents one single subject matter program submitted by an institution of higher education for approval.

Background

The Commission regularly receives recommendations for program approval from subject matter review panels. The content specific subject matter standards are closely aligned to the K-12 academic content standards. These subject matter programs are usually undergraduate courses of study completed before candidates begin teacher preparation programs. However, the two programs may be completed concurrently.

Subject Matter Program Review Procedures

Subject matter educators review the submitting institution's response to the preconditions. The preconditions are based on both state laws and Commission policies and address the minimum unit and content area requirements. The institution's responses to the Commission's subject matter program standards are reviewed by a team of two or more subject matter educators to determine if the program meets the program standards, including the Subject Matter Requirements (SMRs). The SMRs are the content knowledge required to be covered in the program and are aligned to the K-12 content standards that the candidate will be expected to know. If the program does not meet the standards, the institution is given an explanation of the findings. The institution may then submit the additional information requested. Once reviewers determine that the program proposal provides a convincing and adequate body of evidence to meet the Commission's adopted subject matter program standards, the program is recommended to the Commission for approval. After subject matter program approval is granted by the Commission, the institution may admit candidates to the approved subject matter program. Graduates of a Commission-approved subject matter preparation program meet the Commission's SMRs and are not required to take the subject matter examination (California Subject Examinations for Teachers).

Summary of Information on the Proposed Subject Matter Programs

California State University, San Bernardino

California State University, San Bernardino's Bachelor of Arts (BA) in History, Pre-Credential Concentration Program offers candidates the opportunity to master the Single Subject subject matter requirements for Social Sciences. The program not only provides prospective teachers with conceptual knowledge of the subject matter, but also allows them the opportunity to develop academic literacy and discipline-based fluency, addresses issues of equity and diversity, and exposes them to a variety of learning experiences, including a pedagogical and practicum experience appropriate for the discipline. Candidates master the standards not only in the fundamental core courses, but apply their skills further in upper-division courses that enrich

and elaborate on candidates' understanding and ability. The program is delivered through a collaborative and interdisciplinary partnership with the departments of history, economics, political science, and geography, who regularly collaborate on the course content and syllabi to ensure that each of the subject matter preparation program standards are identified, practiced, and assessed. Candidates are carefully advised on how to complete the required curriculum by full-time advising professionals and by faculty in the Department of History. The program is 57 semester units of the 120 units required by students to graduate. California State University, San Bernardino's BA in History, Pre-Credential Concentration Program ensures that graduates have the content knowledge, the abilities, and the experience to become effective and innovative teachers of the social sciences in the twenty-first-century classroom.
