SUBJECT: November 5, 1981 Public Hearing to Review  
Title 5 Regulations

The fourth of five scheduled public hearings to review Title 5 Regulations will be held on November 5, 1981 at the Howard Johnson's Motor Lodge, 2300 Auburn Boulevard, Sacramento, California at 1:30 p.m.

This coded correspondence provides you with a review, conducted by Commission staff, of each regulation to be considered at the November public hearing. This information will enable you to address the staff recommendations, as well as to provide input independent of these recommendations.

This series of five public hearings is being held in accordance with recently enacted legislation (AB 1111) which requires all state agencies to review regulations added to the California Administrative Code prior to July 1, 1980 (Reference: CC80-8129, dated June 10, 1981).

Each regulation is to be analyzed and assessed against five specific standards: Necessity, authority, clarity, consistency and reference (see page 3 for definitions of these standards).

As a result of the review, the Commission will ascertain which of its regulations do or do not meet the five standards. The Commission will then state its intent to retain those regulations that do meet standards, or its intent to amend or repeal those regulations that do not meet standards.

Action to actually amend or repeal any regulation would not be taken without holding a subsequent public hearing for that specific purpose.

The public is invited to participate in the review process and is encouraged to present information, pro or con, orally or in writing, relevant to the regulations under review at the public hearing.

If you wish to make an oral presentation regarding any of the regulations being reviewed, please bring 30 copies of your material for distribution to the Commissioners and staff. If you can provide your statement to the Commission Office 15 days before the public hearing, sufficient copies of the material will be duplicated and distributed for Commission and staff use. We would also appreciate a call to the Commission Office, (916) 445-0184, if you plan to make a presentation in order to schedule time on the agenda for people who wish to address the Commission.

Written statements should be submitted on the attached Review Response Form at least 15 days prior to the public hearing, when that particular regulation is scheduled for review.

CRITERIA FOR REVIEW OF TITLE 5 REGULATIONS

Government Code Section 11349 defines the standards as follows:

- (a) "Necessity" means the need for a regulation as demonstrated in the record of the rulemaking proceeding. Section 11342.2 of the Administrative Code states that the purpose of adopting regulations is "...to implement, interpret, make specific or otherwise carry out the provisions of the statute..." and that "...no regulation adopted is valid or effective unless...reasonably necessary to effectuate the purpose of the statute."
- (b) "Authority" means the provision of law which permits or obligates the agency to adopt, amend or repeal a regulation.

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- (c) "Clarity" means written or displayed so that the meaning of regulations will be easily understood by those persons directly affected by them.
- (d) "Consistency" means being in harmony with, and not in conflict with or contradictory to, existing laws.
- (e) "Reference" means the statute, court decision or other provisions of law which the agency implements, interprets, or makes specific by adopting, amending or repealing a regulation.

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**80418. Reading Requirement.**  
 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, an applicant for a teaching credential shall pass a Commission-approved examination demonstrating a knowledge of the various methods of teaching reading. The passing score for such examination shall be established by the Commission for each yearly period from September 1 to the following August 30.  
 (b) The reading requirement may be satisfied by completion of a Commission-approved program of study not to exceed four semester hours.  
 (c) This section shall not apply to any candidate for a single-subject instruction credential who holds a degree in industrial arts, physical education, music, art, or home economics.  
 NOTE: Authority cited: Section 44225, Education Code. Reference: Sections 44259 and 44285, Education Code.

**80421. Health Education Unit Requirement.**  
 The health education unit requirement specified in Education Code Section 44261 shall be required of each applicant for a full or clear teaching credential issued in accordance with the provisions of Section 44259 of the Education Code. This requirement may be satisfied by a course of study of at least one semester unit, or its equivalent, which may be offered or accepted by an accredited community college, college, or university. This required program of study shall not be required as part of the professional preparation defined in Section 44203 of the Education Code. The teacher education institution recommending the applicant for a full or clear credential shall certify that the applicant has completed satisfactorily the required course of study.

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**80424. Fifth Year of Study.**

(a) The Commission finds that the fifth year of study is an integral element of the teacher education program, and provides the potential teacher with much greater opportunity following completion of the relatively rigid course requirements of the baccalaureate degree program to select a course or program of study designed to improve the teacher's competence and skills, and which is more suited to the candidate's particular professional interests. In recognition of these facts, the Commission expects that the design of the fifth year course of study will be a large responsibility of the teacher candidate in cooperation and consultation with the accredited college or university.

(b) The teacher candidate may select either a student-designed fifth year of study approved by the institution or an institution-designed fifth year of study. The fifth year of study selected by the teacher-candidate shall be a Commission-approved program, and shall be a full academic year, or its equivalent, at the postgraduate level taken at an accredited college or university.

(c) In furtherance of the foregoing concepts, the Commission shall permit a wide latitude for fifth year programs, including, but not limited to the following purposes:

- (1) Additional subject matter preparation including, but not limited to, pursuit of a master's or higher degree;
- (2) Completion of an approved program for an advanced or specialized credential;
- (3) Study undertaken for in-service training for which college or university credit is given; and
- (4) Study undertaken to complete an approved program of professional preparation.

(d) If a college or university refuses to approve a fifth year of study for a teacher-applicant, it shall state its reasons in writing to the applicant. The applicant shall thereafter have the right to appeal the decision of the institution directly to the Commission. In doing so, the applicant shall submit to the Commission a copy of his or her program for the fifth year of study and other supporting documents, including a copy of the college or university's written reasons for refusal. The Commission shall evaluate the materials submitted and determine whether to approve the fifth year of study.

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**80436. Place of Filing of Application.**

Except as otherwise provided, an application for a credential shall be delivered in person or mailed either to the Commission at the address printed upon the application form, or to the Office of the County Superintendent of Schools of the county or local education agency in which the applicant is employed; or in which he or she is seeking employment.

**80439. Date of Filing of Application.**

(a) An application submitted on the form prescribed by Section 80433 shall be deemed filed on the date it is delivered in person pursuant to Section 80436, or if mailed, postage paid, on the postmarked date appearing on the envelope, properly addressed to the Commission or the County Superintendent of Schools.

(b) The Commission may deem the date of filing to be the postmarked date of a communication by the applicant to the Commission or to a County Superintendent of Schools requesting evaluation of transcripts or stating that the writer is thereby applying for a credential. Such date shall apply where the postmark does not predate by more than six months the actual date of filing the prescribed application form and where a school district would lose credit for average daily attendance if the actual date of filing such form were used.

**80442. Personal Identification Cards.**

(a) Except as provided in subsection (c), each applicant for a credential shall submit with the application duplicate personal identification cards provided by the Commission or obtained from the Bureau of Identification of the Department of Justice. Such identification cards shall be completed in the manner required by the instructions on the card.

(b) The fingerprints of the applicant shall be taken by a qualified officer or employee of the state, or of any political subdivision thereof, or by a person designated by the Commission.

(c) Where an applicant is seeking an additional credential and has filed personal identification cards in connection with a previous credential, or renewal thereof, said applicant need not file subsequent cards except upon express request by the Commission.

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80445. Transcripts of Record.  
Each direct application for a credential shall be accompanied by accurate and clear transcripts of record listing college and university courses, including grades earned, completed in fulfillment of the requirements for the credential sought. Such transcripts of record shall also evidence the fulfillment of the scholarship requirements specified in Section 80454.  
NOTE: Authority cited: Section 44225, Education Code.

80448. Affidavits in Lieu of Official Transcripts.  
(a) This section shall apply where an applicant is unable to furnish an accurate and clear transcript of record from an institution because the institution has ceased to exist and the records of that institution have been destroyed, or because the records of the institution are otherwise unavailable.  
(b) The Commission may, in lieu of such accurate and clear transcript of record, accept an affidavit from a reputable person stating in effect that he or she was acquainted with the institution and that the applicant attended such institution.  
(c) In addition to the requirements of subsection (b), the applicant shall furnish an affidavit which shall include the following information:  
(1) A statement that such person attended the institution named in subsection (b).  
(2) A list of courses taken and a brief description of such courses.  
(3) A statement that to the best of his or her knowledge and belief, such courses as are named in the affidavit have been completed.  
(d) To supplement the information required under this section, the Commission may require additional facts to be furnished to the Commission.

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**80454. Scholarship Requirements.**

- (a) When applying directly to the Commission for a credential, the applicant shall meet the scholarship requirements set out in this section.
- (b) In courses above the twelfth grade which are offered toward fulfillment of requirements for a credential, the applicant shall have a grade point average of C or better on a five-point scale, or a grade point average that is required by an approved educational institution for granting a degree.
- (c) Each assignment in directed teaching shall be completed with a grade of C or better on a five-point scale.

**80457. Acceptance of College or University Work for Purposes of Certification in California.**

- (a) Credit earned in colleges or universities is acceptable toward a credential when the type of work for which credit is sought is from an institution approved by the Commission.
- (b) College or university credit earned by means of correspondence or extension courses may be acceptable toward a credential when it can be demonstrated to the Commission that such courses are of a quality comparable to that of the regular on-campus courses offered by the accredited institution.
- (c) Within its discretion the Commission may accept other credit which is approved or accredited by a recognized professional accrediting association.
- (d) Appropriate undergraduate credit earned in an institution not accredited by a recognized regional accrediting association may be accepted as meeting undergraduate credit requirements for a California credential when the applicant has been accepted and is matriculated in a graduate program in a college or university which is accredited by a regional accrediting association for the advanced degree which it grants.
- (e) Credit earned in an institution of higher learning outside of the United States is acceptable toward a credential when the Commission has determined that such institution's programs are comparable to regionally accredited institutions and their programs in the United States.

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**80460. Issuance of Credentials.**

The Commission shall examine applications for credentials. When the Commission is satisfied that the applicant fully meets the standards set by it, the Commission shall issue to the applicant the proper credentials, unless otherwise provided herein.

NOTE: Authority cited: Section 44225, Education Code.

**80463. Date of Issuance of Credentials.**

(a) When all college and university work requirements for a credential are met by the date an application therefor is filed as determined by Section 80439, the credential shall be dated as of the date the application therefor was filed. Such date shall be deemed to be the date of issuance. A date later than such filing date, but not to exceed one year, may be requested at the time of application.

(b) When all college and university work requirements for a credential are not met by the date an application for a credential is filed, the credential shall be dated as of the date on which such requirements shall have been completed. Such date shall be deemed to be the date of issuance, unless a later date is requested pursuant to subsection (a) of this section.

**80466. Teaching Experience in Lieu of Professional Preparation.**

An applicant who has not completed a program of professional preparation in accordance with Section 80472 or 80056 may offer three years of successful full-time teaching experience, all of which has been completed within ten years prior to the date of application. All such teaching experience shall have been acquired in grades one through twelve in public schools or private schools of equivalent status, verified by appropriate administrative officials in the school district or districts where the experience was acquired. The teaching experience shall have been accomplished on a full professional certificate based upon a baccalaureate or higher degree of the state in which the experience was acquired. If a certificate was not required, the applicant shall verify eligibility for such certification at the time. The experience shall be verified on a form prescribed by the Commission, and shall be considered a part of the application. The applicant shall meet all other credential requirements.

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**80469. Delivery of Credentials to a County Superintendent of Schools.**  
Where a credential is issued by the Commission on an application filed through the office of the county superintendent of schools, the Commission shall transmit a copy of the credential, to such county superintendent of schools.

Repeal.  
This is a non substantive procedure which does not affect a candidate's credential eligibility, and may be properly placed in the Commission's policy file.

**80472. Completion of Approved Program or Its Equivalent.**  
In addition to any other requirements specified for obtaining any credential, an applicant for a credential shall fulfill one of the following requirements:  
(a) A California college or university offering a Commission-approved program of professional preparation as a requirement for the credential shall certify that the applicant has completed its approved program and shall recommend the applicant for the appropriate credential; or  
(b) A college or university in a state other than California shall certify that the applicant has completed a program of preparation approved by the state educational certification agency in the state in which it is located. Such approved program of preparation shall be acceptable only if completed in a regionally accredited institution. The applicant shall receive an initial regular credential and must complete other California requirements not included in the out-of-state approved program to obtain a clear credential; or  
(c) An applicant whose professional preparation for a teaching credential is in a state other than California, and with which California has a reciprocity agreement signed pursuant to Section 12500 of the Education Code, shall receive an initial regular credential, and shall be required only to complete the fifth year of study as described in Section 80424 and the requirement in health education specified in Section 80421.
