SUBJECT: Fingerprint Cards Processed by the DOJ and FBI

We knew it was just a matter of time and now the time has arrived. The Commission has been notified by the Department of Justice (DOJ) that they, like the FBI, will require a new fee for resubmitted fingerprint cards unless the original rejected cards are attached.

When the FBI changed its policy last April, the Commission changed its procedures. Instead of returning the rejected card to the applicant, we began to keep the rejected card and send a photocopy to the applicant when reprints were needed. This way we could provide proof of payment and did not have to request additional fees from applicants. Unfortunately, DOJ reprints out number requests for reprints from the FBI and we cannot take on the additional work load of photocopying every card we have to return, especially in the face of the projected budget cuts. The Commission receives no fee for processing fingerprint cards; the entire amount collected is forwarded to the DOJ and FBI.

Beginning immediately, we will return to our policy of sending the rejected cards to the applicant with the following notice:
