Proposed Amendments to Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations Pertaining to the Period of Validity of Examinations for Certification

Final Statement of Reasons

Public Problem

There is no change to the public problem information since the original submission of the Initial Statement of Reasons.

Purpose of Proposed Action

In addition to the original purpose of the proposed action, a supplement to the Initial Statement of Reasons was included in a 15-Day Notice to provide additional modifications to the regulation text to the proposed amendments to 5 California Code of Regulations (CCR) §§80015, 80015.1, and 80071, including supportive rationale for the proposed changes to comply with Government Code §11346.2(b)(1). This includes a general cleanup of the sections to remove items which have passed the sunset date set in regulations and are no longer applicable.

Consideration of Alternatives

The Commission has determined that no reasonable alternative considered by the agency or that has otherwise been identified and brought to the attention of the agency would be more effective in carrying out the purpose for which the action is proposed, would be as effective and less burdensome to affected private persons than the proposed action, or would be more cost-effective to affected private persons and equally effective in implementing the statutory policy or other provision of law.

Mandated Costs

These proposed regulations will not impose a mandate on local agencies or school districts.

15-day Notice

The modifications to the proposed regulations described in the 15-day Notice were approved by the Commission at the September 9, 2016 Commission meeting as part of the Public Hearing. As a part of the 15-day notice, a supplement to the Initial Statement of Reasons was included to indicate modifications to the text and supportive rationale for the proposed changes. No public comments were received during the 15-day Notice period pertaining to the modifications.

Final Text

Text deleted in the 15-day modified text was inadvertently left in the final text attached to the Form 400 and placed in the rulemaking file, and was removed during Office of Administrative Law review. There was no intention by the Commission to reverse its decision in deleting this text.
