SUBJECT: Supporting Documentation Required with Online Recommendations for Clear Teaching Credentials

### **Summary:**

The purpose of this Credential Information Alert (CIA) is to identify the supporting documentation that must be uploaded by induction program sponsors during the online recommendation process at the time teachers are recommended for a clear teaching credential. The provisions outlined herein are effective as of the date of this CIA.

#### **Key Provisions:**

Recently, there have been increasing instances where teachers prepared outside California have been recommended for clear credentials prior to satisfying all the renewal requirements listed on their preliminary/Level I credentials, particularly for the English learner authorization and the program comparability for teachers issued Level I Education Specialist Instruction Credentials based on generic preparation programs.

In these situations, the Commission must invalidate the clear credentials issued to teachers who have not satisfied all credential requirements when identified. For example, if Commission staff notices that an out-of-state prepared teacher was issued a clear credential prior to the date he/she earned an English learner authorization, the clear credential must be invalidated, which causes issues for the teacher and his/her employer.

A similar problem occurs when teachers who hold Level I Education Specialist credentials issued based on out-of-state generic preparation programs complete the equivalent of a preliminary program in California. Teachers who complete the equivalent of a preliminary program are entitled to have the Autism authorization added to their credentials when the specialty area on the Level I credential is Mild/Moderate Disabilities. However, program sponsors cannot

currently add the Autism authorization during the online recommendation process and Commission staff has no way to verify how equivalency was established without documentation. Uploading a letter during the online recommendation process verifying preliminary program equivalency will allow Commission staff to add the Autism authorization when processing applications for the Mild/Moderate Disabilities specialty area as well as to verify how the requirement was satisfied for the Moderate/Severe Disabilities and Early Childhood Special Education specialty areas.

Lastly, the term "(Examination)" must be added to general education teaching credentials for out-of-country prepared teachers and for out-of-state prepared teachers who were issued preliminary credentials with the subject matter competence renewal code (RSMC) who pass the California Subject Examinations for Teachers (CSETs). The lack of the code indicating passage of the CSETs skews the data collected by the Commission and may cause issues for the teachers if this information is needed in the future or when California teachers subsequently move out of state and need to verify their subject matter competence. A photocopy of the CSET examinee score report or a letter verifying completion of a Commission-approved subject-matter program uploaded during the online recommendation process will allow for proper processing of an application.

Induction program sponsors must review the preliminary/Level I credential held by a teacher to determine the renewal requirements that must be satisfied. The documentation necessary to verify completion of all listed renewal requirements must be gathered by the induction program sponsor and must be uploaded during the online recommendation process for the clear teaching credential. Table 1 beginning on page 4 of this CIA provides the renewal codes that may potentially be listed on a preliminary or Level I credential; information on how the associated renewal requirement may be satisfied; and the documentation that must be uploaded during the online recommendation process.

Other renewal codes such as RC (basic skills requirement) and REL (English learner authorization) are often verifiable by staff via the Commission's databases through examination scores or evidence that a teacher has already been issued a CLAD Certificate, English learner authorization, or bilingual authorization. If it is unclear whether the Commission has previously received evidence of completion of renewal requirements, the best practice for program sponsors is to upload all applicable documentation to avoid any potential delays for the applicant.

#### **Important Dates:**

The provisions outlined herein take effect as of the date of this Credential Information Alert.

#### **Background:**

Education Code 44227(b) authorizes Commission-approved programs to submit online applications for educators upon program completion and mandates that the Commission grant credentials based on the program sponsors' recommendations. However, there are other

statutory and regulatory requirements teachers may need to complete to establish their academic eligibility for a clear teaching credential that are not part of an approved induction program. The submission of the documentation outlined in this CIA will allow Commission staff to verify each applicant has satisfied all the statutory and regulatory requirements for the clear credential requested

If a teacher has any of the renewal requirements below listed on their document, in addition to the Induction requirement, the referenced supporting documentation must be uploaded as attachments during the online recommendation process for the clear teaching credential.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup>Letters verifying student teaching must be signed by the Dean, Chair or Director of the teacher education department.

<sup>4</sup>Preliminary program completion letters must be signed by a person authorized to recommend individuals for certification and, for the Mild/Moderate Disabilities specialty area, must verify the applicant completed the requirements for the Autism authorization.

<sup>5</sup>Subject matter equivalency letters must be signed by an analyst at the university designated as an authorized signatory for subject matter equivalency letters.
