What are Local Assignment Options?

Provisions within Education Code (EC) and Title 5 Regulations (T5) that provide local educational agencies (LEAs) with educator assignment options that can be used when an LEA is unable to assign a certificated employee with the appropriate credential.

Local Assignment Option Responsibilities

The Commission:

- °Collects LAOs annual usage data through the California Statewide Assignment Accountability System (CalSAAS)
- Provides Limited Guidance




In the majority of LAOs:

Who is Eligible for Local Assignment Options

Educators with a credential earned based on a BA and student teaching

This definition excludes intern, emergency, waiver, career technical education, and adult education document holders from usage

- Most LAOs require governing board action to authorize the assignment
- $^{\circ}$ Board Action should be taken prior to the start of the educator's assignment
- $^{\circ}$ Usage of LAO should be acknowledged as a matter of public record
- Board approval needs to be given each time an assignment is authorized via LAO, even if educator was authorized for prior assignments

Board Authorizations

- Several LAOs require the educator to have subject matter expertise in order to use the Local Assignment Option
- Often college courses are used to ascertain the expertise, but some can be satisfied through experience
- ° The Commission has no purview over this LEAs should practice due diligence to ensure the educator meets the criteria for the assignment

California Code of Regulations, Title 5, §80005(b)

Contential: BA and Student reaching setting: Departmentalized Content Authorized: Electives Grade Level: K-12 Convent Required: Yes Board Authorization: No

- Classes which do not fall within or are not directly related to the broad subject areas listed in 80005(a)
- Examples include Homeroom, life skills, Student Government, conflict management, and facilitated online courses
- Not like Other LAOs because educators are technically not serving out-of-field
- Requires the educator hold a teaching credential based on a bachelor's degree and student teaching - Intern, Waiver, Provisional Internship Permit (PIP), or Short-Term Staff Permit (STSP) documents are excluded

Education Code §44865

- Allows fully credentialed educator to serve in any assignment in the following settings:

- assignment in the following settings:

 Home teacher primarily for adults
 Hospital classes

 Necessary small high schools

 Continuation schools

 Alternative schools

 Opportunity schools

 Juvenile court schools

 Outly community of adults

 District community day schools

 Independent study

 Home Hospital

- Requires educator hold a teaching credential based on a bachelor's degree and student teaching Intern, Waiver, Provisional Internship Permit (PIP), or Short-Term Staff Permits (STSP) are excluded
- Can verify Local Educational Agencies are running alternative programs by searching for them at the CDE's California School Directory

Education Code

- Allows Educators authorized in self contained settings to teach in departmentalized courses, up to 8th grade
- Educator must have earned 12 lower/6 upper division units at an accredited institution in the subject being authorized in order to be eligible

§44258.7(c)(d)

- The committee on assignments shall include an equal number of teachers, selected by teachers, and school administrators, selected by school administrators
- An "elective course" is a course other than English, Mathematics, Science, or Social Studies
- Assignments approved by the committee on assignments shall be for a maximum of one school year, but may be extended by action of the committee

Education Code §44258.3

Credential Non-Emergency Credential Setting: Departmentalized Content Authorized: Any Grade Level: K-12 Consent Required: Yes Board Authorization: Yes Subject Matter Expertise: Yes

- Allows Educators authorized in departmentalized settings to teach in any content in grades K-12
- Governing boards using this option must establish specific policies and procedures to verify that the teacher to be assigned has adequate knowledge of the subject to be taught
- Governing boards must utilize subjectmatter specialists in development of the process of verifying a teacher's competence in the subject being assigned

Education Code §44263

Contential Any Teaching Credential Service Departmentalized/Self-Contained Content Authorized Any Stude Level K-12 Consent Required Not Specified Board Authorization: Yes Judget Matter Expertise: Yes

- in <u>departmentalized</u> settings educator must have earned 18 lower/9 upper division units at an accredited institution the subject being authorized in order to be eligible for usage
- in <u>self-contained</u> settings educator must have earned at least 60 semester hours equally distributed among the 10 areas of a diversified major set forth in Section 44314 to be eligible for usage

Education Code §44258.2

Crodential: Single Subject or Secondary Secting. Departmentalized Content, Authorized: Any Grade Level: 5-8 Consent Required: Yes Board Authorization: Yes Subject Matter Expertise: Yes

- Allows educators authorized in departmentalized settings to teach in any content in middle school classrooms
- Educator must have earned 12 lower/6 upper division units at an accredited institution in the subject being authorized in order to be eligible
