

Nomination and Election of Co-Chairs for 2022-2023

June 2022

Overview of this Report

This item calls for the Committee on Accreditation to nominate and elect individuals to serve as the Co-Chairs – one from K-12 education and one from post-secondary education – for the 2022-23 meeting year. The nominations and elections shall take place in accordance with the adopted procedures of the Committee on Accreditation (Committee). Nominations were opened at the May 2022 meeting and will be closed at the June 2022 meeting. Additionally, the Committee will vote to elect its Co-Chairs for the 2022-2023 year at this meeting.

Staff Recommendation

Staff recommends that the Committee vote to elect two individuals to serve as Co-Chairs of the Committee for the 2022-2023 year.

Background

The Committee has developed a [Procedures Manual](#) to govern its activities. Chapter Two addresses the Organization of the Committee. It lists the officers as two Co-Chairs – one representing K-12 public education and one representing post-secondary education – and describes their duties, procedures for the election of officers, a description of terms and term limits, and a mechanism for appointing officers pro-tempore.

According to the Procedures Manual, the “...nominations are to be made at the next to last regularly scheduled meeting of the Committee and the election should take place at the last Committee meeting of the year.” The last Committee meeting of the year for 2022 is the June 2022 meeting. The Administrator of Accreditation opened nominations for the Co-Chairs for 2022-23 at the May 2022 meeting. The nominations will remain open through the start of the agenda item at the June 2022 meeting. It will be closed at the June 2022 meeting and then the Committee will vote to elect Co-Chairs.

Eligibility of Members for the Co-Chair

Section 202 of the Procedures Manual states, “No member of the committee shall be elected to the office of Co-Chair of the Committee for more than two one-year terms.” Committee members may waive its Procedures Manual through a vote to allow for an individual to serve more than two terms, should it desire to do so. Bob Frelly has served two terms as Co-Chair in 2018-19 and 2019-20. The Committee subsequently voted to waive its Procedures Manual to re-elect Dr. Frelly to two more terms in 2020-21 and 2021-22 for a total of four terms. No other current Committee member has previously served as Co-Chair of the Committee to date. If a member plans to make a nomination, the consent of the individual must be obtained.

At the May 2022 meeting, members of the Committee nominated Bob Frelly, Martin Martinez, and Katrine Czajkowski as Co-Chairs. Additional nominations will be accepted at the June meeting prior to closing the nominations and vote by the Committee.
